# February and Valentines Day

January is the jet lag of December, March wishes it were April, but February is its own month. Noble in its peaceful whiteness, the depth of its snow drifts and the thickness of its ice. February is unique in its number of days.

February is the only month that can be pronounced four different ways. It's the birth date of presidents and the month of lovers. Let us all praise February.



There are two legends in relation to the origins of Valentines Day. One stems from Greek Mythology and the other an obscure Roman Catholic feast day. Both are steeped in romance.

According to Greek Mythology the middle of February is coupled with love and fertility. February is dedicated to the sacred marriage of Zeus and Hera. Zeus is considered to be the greatest Greek God and the ruler of the Olympian Gods. Hera was considered the Queen of the Gods.

In the Christian culture, there are at least three different St. Valentines. The most popular one dates back to Roman Emperor Claudius II. It was said that Claudius wanted to rule over a vast army. He realized that married men, not wanting to leave their wives and families, were reluctant to join the Roman Army. Claudius decided to enact a law banning marriage. A priest named Valentine found that this decree unacceptable and secretly continued to perform marriages.

When discovered, Valentine was jailed and sentenced to death. Many young people, including a prison guard's daughter, visited him in the jail, throwing flowers and notes. The young woman's father allowed her to sit and talk in Valentine's cell...and Valentine fell in love with her. On the day of his execution, February 14, 269AD, he left her, "a note thanking her for her



friendship and loyalty." It was signed, "Love from your Valentine." This note is believed to be the origin of the custom of exchanging love messages on Valentines Day.

"It is no surprise that by the middle ages, Valentine was one of the most popular saints in England and France." The custom of exchanging cards and love tokens on February 14th developed in England and France during the 14th and 15th centuries. Valentines Day was probably arrived in North America along with settlers from Britain during the 19th century.

### Customs, Traditions, Symbols

The most recognized custom associated with Valentines Day is the mutual exchange of love notes or valentines. Traditional symbols of Valentines Day are hearts, the colors red and pink, and the winged figure of Cupid (in Roman mythology, Cupid's parents were the Goddess Venus and the God Mars; Eros, Aphrodite, and

Ares are the earlier Greek equivalents). By the 19th Century mass-produced cards became popular and were given—not just to a special loved one—to friends and family. Over the last 50 years in the United States, gifts of chocolate, tiny message candy hearts, roses, and even jewelry have become a common practice.

### Changes to Dog Licensing Law

Effective January 15, 2006

Dog licenses issued on and after January 15, 2006, must not expire after the expiration date of the dog's rabies certificate. In order to receive a full year license, a dog that is due for a rabies vaccination booster within the next license year would need to be immunized prior to license renewal.

This change affects all dogs licensed in New York State, except those licensed in New York City, which has a separate dog licensing law. There are more than 600 dogs registered in the Town of Danby.

Pursuant to the New York Public Health Law, county public health authorities must offer free clinics at least every four months for the rabies vaccination of dogs as well as for cats and domesticated ferrets.

On Monday, January 9, 2006 the Town Board passed a resolution to allow its residents the option of licensing dogs for a period of up to three years (but never beyond the vaccination expiration). The Town Clerk will collect an appropriate annual fee for the license.

- 13. Set the Town Board Monthly Meetings for 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday, every month during 2006, 6:30–8:30pm.
- 14. Reaffirmed the Town of Danby Procurement Policies and Procedures.
- 15. Approve Town Supervisor's appointment of Councilperson Norbert Nolte as Deputy Town Supervisor.
- 16. Appoint Robert Roe as Planning Board Chair and to the Tompkins County EMC (Environmental Management Council).
- 17. Appoint Ted Jones as Board of Zoning Appeals Chair.
- 18. Reappoint Russell Klinger to BZA (Board of Zoning Appeals) (5 year term).

# MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL ALL-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN Submitted by Sue Beeners

The Town Board may consider adoption of this plan at its Regular Meeting on Monday, March 13.

This plan has been developed by seven municipalities and the County over the last three years. It contains a detailed evaluation of hazards, including but not limited to flooding, severe storms, utility failure, epidemic, fire, and major transportation accidents. It identifies strategies for minimizing risk and effects resulting from these hazards. Strategies in the plan, specific to Danby, were developed with input from the Fire and Highway Departments and the West Danby Water District.

# Comprehensive Plan Task Force

On January 11, the Task Force responded to January 2 requests from the Town Board for recommendations on the following:

A. The charge to the Task Force, membership, voting, and subcommittees. Chair and Vice Chair, staff and consultant support, and general work plan. The Task Force made the following recommendations for Town Board approval:

- Appointment of Ray Van de Bogart as Chair, and Joel Gagnon as Vice Chair, with appointments to be made annually by the Town Board upon recommendation of the Task Force.
- Appointment of a Secretary, in addition to staff support from the Code Enforcement Officer and such other paid assistance as the Town Board agrees to make available.
- All Danby residents and property owners may vote at the Task Force, provided that they have attended at least one of the previous two meetings. A record of the vote will be made.
- Specific proposals developed by the Task Force will be referred simultaneously to the Town Board and the Planning Board in order to promote creative interaction, with the Town Board retaining authority for final approval.
- B. Removal of the 60% Conservation Area requirement in the Low Density Zone, and reinstatement of a Permit Process for Minor Land Divisions:
- The Task Force had previously recommended these revisions to the Town Board, and has authorized its staff support to proceed with drafting specific revisions.
- A set of further revisions and enhancements, which was subject to a Town Board public information meeting in October, will be further refined in the upcoming months.

The next Task Force Meeting is 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 8, at the Town Hall.

As a general note, anyone is welcome to join the Task Force.

# Town of Danby Fire Commissioners

Thanks to all who voted in the recent Town of Danby Fire Commissioner election. We would like to clarify some statements that were circulated prior to the recent election.

The Board of Fire Commissioners is made up of five (5) qualified individuals who are elected and perform as prescribed by New York State laws (primarily Town Laws #174 through 176). Votes in annual commissioner elections are not counted by the commissioners. They are counted by an election committee per Town Law.

Basic responsibility of the board is to oversee the operation of the fire departments within the district as representatives of the taxpayers and assure that all operations are conducted as prescribed by law. This includes developing and managing budgets that insure departments are properly equipped to provide adequate emergency services to the district. The budget for 2006 is \$305,838 compared to the 2005 budget of \$277,689. This results in a 10.1% increase. The increase is primarily due to increased heating and vehicle

fuel costs, vehicle maintenance costs and higher insurance premiums. Insurance premiums are estimated to be 29% higher than the 2005 budget. Due to increased assessed value in the town, the tax rate is not increased from 2005. The board is actively searching for ways to reduce both fuel and insurance costs.

The board is not planning a \$1,000,000 building addition to the Danby Fire Station. There is a committee made up of Fire Department and Board of Commissioner members studying a possible addition to the building. This addition is needed as the building currently houses four vehicles in a building designed for three. Due to increased requirements for record keeping and reporting, additional office space would also be desirable. Design and costs have not yet been established. Funding for this will hopefully be partially provided through grants with the remainder via bonding with approval of the Town of Danby voters.

Board of Fire Commissioner Meetings are open to the public. Meetings are held at 7:30 PM on the third Tuesday of each month; at the West Danby Station during even-numbered months and at the Danby Station during odd-numbered months.
