ADIRONDACK WILD LIVE: SCOTT B. ADAMS & ERIC ACETO

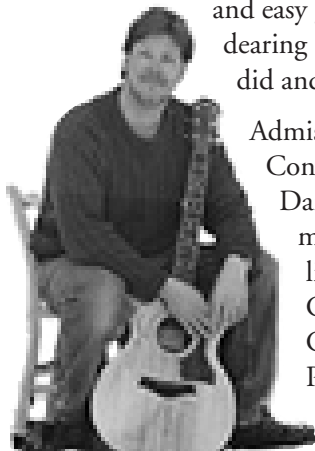

The next performance in the *free* Danby Concert Series will feature Scott B. Adams on Sunday November 12 at 3pm in the Danby Town Hall. Scott has forged a career by capturing landscapes and bits of history from the Adirondacks, The Finger Lakes, and the rest of New York State, and turning them into lush acoustic instrumental and lyrical music compositions.

This program includes Scott B. Adams on guitar, banjo and vocals with Eric Aceto on violin and mandolin. There will also be a large high-definition projection screen with synchronized digital video footage of the critically acclaimed PBS special: Adirondack Wild produced by Paul Frederick. The spectacular scenery turns the show into a four season musical and visual tour through the Adirondack mountain region of New York.

Crossing traditional boundaries, elements of Folk, Jazz, Celtic, Classical and Pop music can be found intertwined in his songs. Through songs and instrumentals, as well as poems, tales, and historic snippets, Scott's concerts work as a cohesive program that entertains beyond the average musical recital.

In addition to his masterful guitar work, Scott's humor and easy going nature have a way of endearing him to audiences for a splendid and memorable experience.

INTERNET OPTIONS TO BE TOPIC OF D.C.C. MEETING

Danby residents have been asking how their homes can receive high speed internet, especially where wired broadband service is not available. To discuss options, John Guttridge, representing Ithaca's Lightlink Internet and Black Box Computer, will be the guest of Danby Community Council's meeting on November 8.

One intriguing technology being employed by both large (San Francisco) and small (Iqaluit, Nunavut) communities is Wireless Wi-fi, where the internet is delivered via radio waves rather than by wire. A municipal wireless network consists of a series of access points that are placed by engineers in a pattern that permits maximum coverage with minimal signal loss throughout the designated coverage area.

Is affordable wireless internet service even possible for Danby, with its challenging topography? If you are able to download a government PDF in less than an hour, the FTC's September report [<http://www.ftc.gov/os/2006/10/v060021municipalprovwirelessinternet.pdf>] is worth checking out for definitions and discussion. [*The report is heavy reading, but informative—editor*] ❀

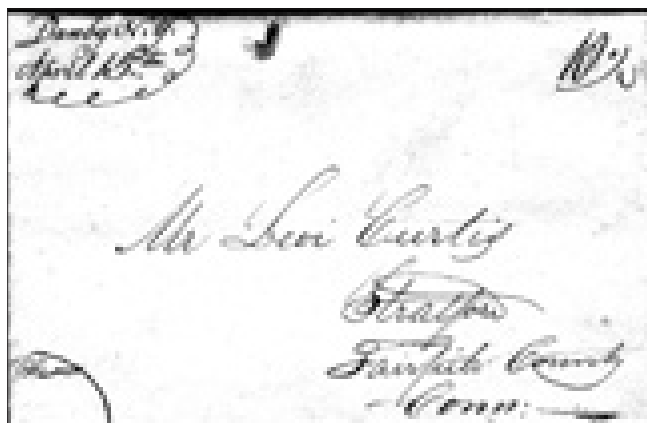
Here's the last part of the second of two 19th century Danby letters that Peter Fraissinet of West Danby shared with Joan. The paragraphing, misspelled words, and grammatical errors are as written.

Addressed to: Mr. Levi Curtis, Stratford, Fairfield County, Conn., dated Danby, April 11th 1824

Tuesday June 13, 1824

Dear Sally,

I did not think my letter would lie so long when I wrote. Elbert said he would write a P.S. He has had so much business that he could not spend time. I am a going to tell you of the visits that I have made, I have not make very many on account of the weather and bad traveling. Maria B. and E. Bush came to see me the second week after I arrived here and Sally B. Mr. Daniel B.'s daughter has been a number of times the same day that Maria B. came Mary Beers came. Mrs. Danson has been here with her family, she looks very different from what I expected one much handsomer, little Helenorce is a handsome little girl, she was much pleased with her present, Mrs. Danson sends her love to you. I am very much pleased with M. and Hanna and their looks too. M. is going to move to morrow to Owego Creek. I have been and made them a visit and Sally B. too, and talked of going to M. Bush's this week if the weather is pleasant. I have seen Selia C.'s wife she that was M. Beers and Miss Ann Tompson and E. Banfield and M. Hitchcock. I like the young ladies very much. I must tell you that I have had as much Shugar as I could cut a week a go yesterday Sally B. came to call me to the Shugar camp. I went and Dr. Sherwood waited on us, we had large wooden spoons to eat with the day after Eli made and then cut all day. Two days after that I went to Mr. Nathan Beers's and they was a making Shugar and Eli made yesterday again so you may think I have had enough. There was two weddings last evening in Danby not any body that I know. I must tell you that when the ground is settled



I am a going to ride a horseback with the other girls that will suit me. I think I grow fleshy every day when I arrived here I weighed 99 pounds but I do not think I lost any on the road for I like to travel. I must tell you that little Lewis improves fast, I expect if I do not have a good opportunity to go home next fall I shall stay till next spring and then you will see little Lewis. I suppose that Cornelia will be grown up when I get home I wish I could see her with the rest of our family. I have got a book that I write in every thing that happens and the book that I read & c. Aunt P. going with me in love to you all and the rest of the family. From your Sister----B.

Cady sends a great deal of love.

I must tell you that I am a working a toilet curtain a very handsome one that Sister Phebe began. And I am knitting a pair of stockings for Eli. Aunt Phebe has made me a present of Sister P.'s black [Nankin?] crape and I have made oversleeves like my calico

only handsomer and put my crape on the bottom the waist is very handsome it is made with a corded bosom loose in the neck. So write as often as you can Sarah/ My basket is much admired. Give my love to Grandmother. Do not let any body see this. Good bye. ❀

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Winter is fast approaching and, as a reminder, please remember these safety tips this winter.

- Local Law No. 1 of 1990 prohibits parking on roadways. Please park your vehicles in your driveway. This will allow safer and quicker snow removal of our roadways.
- Please do not place garbage cans and/or recycling bins in the way of snow removal equipment. We do not want to hit them or place snow in them. The snowplow wing will miss your garbage cans and recycling bins, but only if they are kept back far enough from the shoulder of the road. We will not cross the center-line of the road to avoid hitting these items and possibly endanger other motorists or our road crew.
- Lastly, do not tailgate snow removal vehicles. Snow and ice covered roads can present unknown hazards.

This local law allows for the emergency towing of any vehicle parked or abandoned on any highway within the Town of Danby that hinders or impairs the ability of the personnel of the Town of Danby, or any other governmental agency, to respond to a snowstorm, flood, fire, or other occurrence to which a prompt response is necessary or desirable, may be removed by the Town of Danby. The towing is at the owner's expense.

HOW WELL IS YOUR WATER?

Residents of Tompkins County who drink water from privately owned, residential wells will have an opportunity to test their well water for contamination and to learn how to best protect their wells.

A program sponsored by the Cayuga Lake Watershed Network and the Town of Danby is being offered from 7–9pm on Wednesday, November 15, at the Danby Town Hall. Thanks to funding from the Tompkins County Department of Health, participants will also receive a 75% discount on bacteria and nitrate tests of their well water.

Pre-registration is required at the Cayuga Lake Watershed Network office 607.532.4104 or [manager@cayuga.lake.org].

The November 15th program will provide information about common sources of water contamination, maintenance methods to prevent contamination, water sample preparation, and interpretation of well water test results. Participants will receive bottles for water samples; the bottles will be collected the following morning, 8–9:30am at the Danby Town Hall for analysis by a certified laboratory. Results will be distributed by mail.

Sharon Anderson, Watershed Steward with the Cayuga Lake Watershed Network, urges all well users to have their supply tested at least once a year, and sooner if a change is noted in the quality of the water. While public water systems are tested frequently as required by federal and state standards, private well testing is the responsibility of the owner. ❧

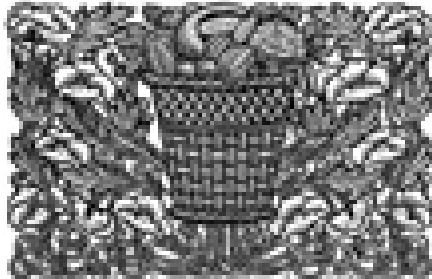
