DANBY TOWN HISTORY

South Danby, 100 Years Ago by Dewitt Traver

Dewitt Traver was born in Poughkeepsie, New York in Dutchess County on the Hudson, November 6, 1850. Along with his parents, Miles and Julia Traver, he moved to the Town of Danby in 1851, at the age of 5 months. He spent the rest of his life in Danby.

When he married at the age of 21, he purchased 10 acres of land in South Danby for \$100 and ended up owning an 800 acre valley. It is sufficient to say that he was a successful pioneer farmer. Dewitt was married three times and yet lived as a widower for his last 28 years and during that time he kept detailed diaries of life in South Danby.

The first year he documented was 1907 and the entries are both fascinating and informative.

Monday February 18—To Ithaca have a contract drawn up with T.S. Ward for his place on the hill, pay him \$3,000 first part of April and take possession then.

Saturday March 9—Buy a vaporator pan of E.B. Hill price \$4.00.

Monday March 11—Buy a vaporator of E.B. Hill and all the rig for sapping it, 275 buckets, storing tank and gathering tub. Price \$25.00. Go and get it. Nice day.

March 14—Draw over some lumber to build a sap house in the woods.

March 18—Bought 100 spiles of Elbert Hill. Price \$3.00.

Saturday April 13—Go to Ithaca, buy 50 syruip cans price 9 cents each.

Tuesday April 25—Chet Dorn died today. Sick 3 days a stout young man 20 years old.

Monday June 17—Sold my wool to Edwards 800 lbs. come to \$209.15. Mrs. William Howland buried today.

Wednesday June 19—Fred goes off to get married.

Friday June 19—Elsie Mosher [*Dewitt's third wife*] born June 5, 1854. Mosher woman here after some pictures.

Monday June 25—To Ithaca, get Fred a stove price \$18.00.

Thursday July 4—Fred commence keeping house that leaves Ed and I to keep house alone. Slight frost in the hollow this morning.

Sunday July 14—Ed and I we live alone now. Chestnut trees in bloom.

Saturday July 20—William Howland buried.

Thursday August 29—Go to Frank Dorn's funeral.

Saturday August 31—Finish sawing wood I sold to Norm Stevens.

Monday September 17—To Spencer after canvas I sent for 14x20 feet cost \$9.00. Freight \$1.00.

Wednesday October 2—Had a frost every month this year except September.

Saturday October 12—I go to Hollister's to look at a yoke of cattle. Bought them of Warren Hollister price \$150.00. Six years old.

Friday October 25—Bought 20 bushels of potatoes from Lew Cooper price 45 cents a bushel.

Monday November 14—Bought 4 pigs of Allen price \$1.25 a piece.

Tuesday December 12—Bought a new side hill plow of Gus Bingham price \$12.00.

Dewitt Traver is the grandfather of Ken Traver of South Danby Road who so generously shared his grandfathers diaries. In 1977 Ken's wife, Lois, chose the most interesting excerpts and presented them to her husband as a gift. ❀

PLANNING BOARD NOTES

At the Planning Board Meeting held on Thursday, July 19, 2007, Preliminary and Final subdivisions were approved for:

- 1. Parcel 26.-1-14, located on Spencer Road south of Hillview Road, into three lots of about 37, 37, and 57 acres.
- 2. Parcel 30.1-6.3, located on LaRue Road near South Danby Road, into two lots of about 2 and 14 acres.
- 3. Parcel 14.-1-27.22, located on Danby Road near VanDeBogart Road, into three lots of about 7, 5, and 11 acres.

The Planning Board also asked that a report be made to the Town Board indicating that it strongly upholds their June 21st recommendation on thresholds for land divisions by permit, where lots of 10 acres or larger would be eligible for permit, and where smaller lots would be eligible for permit at a rate of one (1) in five (5) years. The opportunity for subdividers to come to the Planning Board is always an option. ❄

COMPACT & FLUORESCENT!

Compact Fluorescent Bulbs (CFLs) are alternatives to traditional incandescent light bulbs that use 66 percent less energy, reducing the emissions that result fossil-fuel-burning power plants!

CFLs can also save you money since they use so much less energy; a 70 watt equivalent CFL can save \$20.02 a year! However, CFLs contain low levels of mercury, a toxic metal, and it can cause damage to the brain, spinal cord, kidneys, and liver so proper disposal and recycling is important.

Households are exempt from Hazardous Waste Regulations but they are still strongly urged to dispose of these hazardous materials in a safe way, including fluorescent bulbs. If a CFL breaks in your home, immediately open windows to allow for vapor to dissipate and sweep the fragments (do not vacuum!) into a plastic bag for disposal. Make sure to wipe the area with a disposable paper towel to remove all glass fragments. These broken bulbs can be recycled as well.

How can CFLs be recycled?

Tompkins County Solid Waste (TCSW) has accepted CFLs from Households and Small Businesses for several years as part of its Household Hazardous Waste Program (HHW). Recently TCSW has created a year-round drop-off container for CFLs; they are shipped to Chicago where the mercury is safely removed and recycled, as are the glass and metal parts.
