### Danby Housing Growth

The following shows housing units and other major construction completed since the 2000 Census. In estimating population increase from 2000 to present, the 2000 average of 2.53 persons per household was used.

As shown, Danby grew by an average of 17 new housing units per year during the 1990s, but more than 20 new units per year since the date of the US Census, April 1, 2000.

#### Redeveloping Agriculture in Danby

Elizabeth Keokosky, a Danby resident, is proposing the creation of what she calls a, "Land Bank Cooperative." With agricultural commodities at record high prices and fossil fuel prices making biofuels increasingly attractive,

### Tompkins County Barn Report and Contest

In an effort to recognize our important agricultural heritage, Historic Ithaca has created the *Tompkins County Barn Project* contest to help our citizens discover and celebrate this significant type of landmark.

Anyone with an interest in their older barn, silo, chicken house, or other type of agricultural outbuilding is encouraged to enter. Who knows...you might have the oldest barn, tallest silo, biggest chicken coop, best corn crib, or the only existing hop house in the county! ### Danby Fire District Grant Status

The Danby Fire District, representing the Danby and West Danby Volunteer fire companies, recently applied for two grants offered by the FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) Assistance to Firefighters program.

The first application is a \$285,000 request, for a rescue-pumper to replace Danby's 19-year old engine. The second is for multiple sets of turnout coats and pants for the firefighters, and a stationary airfill system to refill the air bottles for self-contained breathing apparatus.

If awarded a grant, FEMA pays 95 percent of the award and theDistrict would be responsible for only 5 percent--a great bargain. The District was successful in obtaining FEMA AFG grants in 2004 and 2005 when it applied for grants to purchase new self-contained breathing apparatus, a thermal imaging camera to aid in fire detection and rescue, and training equipment such as computer software, a desktop computer, two laptops, and two projectors. The District unsuccessfully requested the rescue-pumper grant in 2006 and 2007. FEMA will announce awards during the second half of 2008, so please keep your fingers crossed for your fire district.

Earlier this year, the Danby Volunteer Fire Company also applied for a grant that provides Polaris 6-wheeled all-terrain vehicles to fire companies but our application competed with 2,000 others and was rejected. This vehicle would've helped us deliver personnel and equipment to remote locations when needed for rescues (such as injured or lost hunters or hikers) or brush fire attack.

Our next grant application will be completed in May and is offered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation for fire suppression equipment pertaining to firefighting on state forest lands.

In other news, the Danby Fire District is pleased to report it has received notification from Senator Seward that a legislative initiative in the amount of \$15000 was included in the 2008-2009 state budget to be used for equipment for the Danby fire station addition.

the business model she proposes would aggregate available land for use by entrepreneurs who need it. She is developing the idea for her Master's Thesis.

Danby has a lot of unused and little-used acreage that might make sense to return to production. The cooperative she proposes would act as a broker, or middleman, making it easier for those in search of usable land to find it.

Putting money into the hands of land owners (by sharing in the profits of farm contractors, and by qualifying the owners for agricultural assessments) would reduce the pressure to sell to developers. The planning board listened with interest, offered encouragement, and suggested the names of several Danby landowners who could be approached to gauge interest.

Cooperative Extension also run a program called *Land-Link*. This database helps to connect land owners with those looking for land, either beginning farmers or those looking to diversify. Free and confidential, the service is geared toward enabling one-on-one negotiations rather than aggregating land for large enterprises.

Landowners interested in leasing, loaning, or selling, and would-be farmers looking for land should contact Cooperative Extension at 607.272.2292. This program covers Tompkins, Tioga, Schuyler, Cortland, and Chemung counties.

### Hamlet Planning

The sense of the group seemed to be that, since there are currently relatively few proposals needing the planning board's attention, the board itself can play a more active role.

How best to involve the public? Meeting with an invited group of "key stakeholders" to organize the task was proposed, but the concern was raised that those not invited would take offense. If all are to be invited, then the board should be positioned to effectively constructively harness the resultant interest. Organizing the overall effort in advance is vital.

The board agreed to review existing ocuments, particularly the Comprehensive Plan's objectives and strategies related to hamlet planning, as a basis for thinking bout how to structure the task. This eview was expected at the board's next scheduled meeting, on April 17.
