COMM. COUNCIL UPDATE

The July meeting of the Danby Community Council began with a visit from Rick Dobson, who expressed concern over the lack of a sidewalk along Route 96B, be-

tween Miller and Michigan Hollow Roads. He also wanted the 45MPH speed limit extended north of Miller Road, through the Danby residential area, and suggested that Danby should have permanent flags through the town.

The Council approved a resolution supporting the extension of the 45 mile per hour limit as well the sidewalk. In addition, speed monitors in Danby will be requested from the Sheriff's department. Joel Gagnon suggested that the Hamlet Planning Group could assist with these concerns.

There was a lengthy discussion of our ongoing youth programs. A youth group meets Fridays to help plan Fun Day, including the preparation of banners for the parade and games and activities for kids. The weekly Farmer's Market, 3:30-6:30pm on Thursdays, provides summer jobs for teens and fresh produce for purchase.

This year, Cornell Cooperative Extension, with Danby Community Council support, is beginning a pilot program for employment of Danby youth in a group setting. Cooperative Extension is recruiting the workers and team leader for the crew. Ric Dietrich is developing local community projects. The first project, at Jennings Pond, began on on July 14. Karen Coleman commented that the pilot program may become a yearly event.

Bea Hogben attended our meeting and spoke about the Danby Community Library. She reported that 41 books

Supervisor's Update

Because of the energy crisis in this country, gas companies are looking seriously at the Finger Lakes area for gas exploration. A bill has been passed by the NYS legislature and is being considered by Governor Paterson. It will allow horizontal drilling, which might lead to a gas boom in the Southern Tier.

Horizontal drilling is much cheaper than vertical drilling since you don't have to dig as far to get your product. The topography of Danby is suitable for horizontal drilling. So far, the Danby Town Board has not thought that drilling in the state forests or in the Town itself is good for the community. Perhaps it is time to slow down the process if we can and give town and planning boards the time to comment on this issue.

The Ithaca Journal reported that some residents are concerned that horizontal gas exploration could contaminate their water supply. Is this likely or possible? Should we put pressure on the state to tax these new enterprises? If gas is found should some revenues return to the Town? At this time of escalating fuel prices, this may become a pressing issue.

GARDEN TOUR IN DANBY

Wayne Myers extensive garden at 1071 Michigan Hollow Road in West Danby will be open to the public, 10am-3pm, on Sunday, August 3. He has six acres of rolling lawn and perennial beds containing more than 550 different varieties of perennials nestled behind and between fieldstone walls and structures. Features include a covered bridge (listed with the New York State Covered Bridge Society), a working water wheel on a hand-built-post-and-beam constructed feed mill, and a huge glass sponge fossil rock. All this is set against the backdrop of the Danby State Forest and blends in with the native wild plants of the area.

The local law amendments to increase the fees for dog licensing and for towing of vehicles that are creating a traffic hazard were both approved.

On the towing and storage fees matter, it was clarified that the driving force for the change in the law was a disparity between what is normally charged by towing companies and what Danby's local law allowed to be charged. Also, fees are not as standardized as had been implied by the language of the law. Fees vary depending on distance to be towed and the manner of towing, for example. The law sets a ceiling on the charges but does not preclude lower charges.

The dog licensing law change elicited both on and off-topic discussions about dogs. The dog fee discussion centered on clarifying that there is no difference in fees between purebred dogs and what were termed mongrel dogs. Somehow the information in the Danby News seems to have created the impression that a fee structure that would distinguish between dog types was proposed. It wasn't, and Danby has never had any such differential fee structure.

Enforcement of the dog control ordinance was also discussed. The board was pressed to clarify whether the town is willing to use the town attorney to enforce the ordinance, or whether complainants are on their own. According to a speaker, the town attorney has indicated that she would not prosecute violations on the town's behalf. Ric Dietrich, Town Supervisor, said he would investigate further.

The Town Supervisor was authorized to sign a contract with Tompkins County to enable receipt of a grant approved by the county for, "Recognizing Danby's Rural Cemeteries". Joan Grant, town historian, is the moving force behind this. The money will pay for adding information about the cemeteries to brochures about Danby used to promote tourism. Money for the grant comes from county room tax revenues.

In other action, the board increased the mileage allowance for town business from 50.5 cents (in place since the beginning of the year) to 58.5 cents/mile, mirror-

ing a similar increase in the federal mileage reimbursement rate. The Town Court was authorized to apply for state grant money up to \$30,000 for improvements to court facilities.

Comprehensive Plan Implementation Task Force

The Task force met on July 9. The meeting focused on the, *Local Law Related to the Right to Engage in Agricultural Activity*, Danby's proposed and somewhat broader version of a Right-to-Farm law.

In response to comments on an earlier draft made by the County Planning Department, the group considered simply substituting the state definition of sound agricultural practices for the definition previously included in the draft law. The Danby definition mentioned environmentally sustainable practices, a phrase absent in the state definition. The state definition of sound ag practices, however, is basically whatever the Commissioner of Agriculture says it is.

The group decided to include the state definition, but to augment it by broadening the section, peculiar to the Danby law, that explicitly describes the agricultural practices determined to be sound within the Town of Danby, including a new one termed, "sustainable agricultural practices". Those are practices which, if engaged in indefinitely in their appropriate and careful usage, would not result in the net loss of soil or other serious environmental damage. The group then set that draft aside pending feedback from the Town Board.

The balance of the meeting was a discussion of possible future initiatives. Joel Gagnon floated a proposal for lots by permit that would integrate flag lot regulations into a simplified set of standards based on frontage, acreage, and visibility. This prompted a brief discussion of whether such a significant change should be pursued at this time or whether "changing a few numbers" in the subdivision regulations might be more expedient.

Naomi Strichartz proposed that the group look at wind and other alternative energy with an eye to enabling these. Efforts to promote tourism, to improve broadband access, and to investigate the feasibility of a Danby Post Office were also suggested.

The list will be revisited at the next meeting, scheduled for 7pm on August 13, in the Town Hall.

Fun Day: An Incomplete History

Danby Fun Day is a decades-long tradition, supporting the Danby Volunteer Fire Department and bringing the Danby community together for a day of food and games, music, and celebration. A relatively small number of dedicated people have organized this for several years. To keep the spirit of Danby Fun Day strong, they hope that more people will get involved.

Since at least the 1970s, Danbyites have gathered together in July for a one-day event known variously as the Danby Carnival, the Danby Fair, and Danby Fun Day. A full history of the Danby Fair, gathering information from everyone involved would be a wonderful thing.

In the 1970s and 80s, a community-wide parade kicked off the Danby Fair. The tradition slipped away in the 1990s and was revived in 2002 by the Danby General Store owners, Toni McBride and Judy VanDermark. Their friends and co-workers, Amy Cusimano and Sue Beeners have kept the tradition alive ever since.

Danby Fun Day has always been a family event. Five

years ago, Andrea Hazard and her family got involved by making child friendly games including the duck race, bean bag, and ring toss games. They emerge from garage attic storage each year for Fun Day. In her fifth year as a Fun Day volunteer and organizer, Hazard is happy to play a role coordinating children's games. "This is easy, as Tom Archibald does most of the work," Hazard says.

The Danby Youth, with the help of Youth Program leader Tom Archibald, now do much of the planning. They design signs and T-Shirts, plan activities, and run the games during Fun Day.

Many Danby Fun Day activities are planned by members of the Danby Fire Department. Popular elements, including the Chicken BBQ, Cake Wheel, and book sale are all fund raisers for the emergency volunteers.

Sue Beeners has recognized the need for a community connection, "When I started to be involved...the event was on the shoulders of the Danby Fire Department and...community volunteers had dwindled," Beeners says. "This is the only town-wide event where residents get together to have fun...show support for our fire and emergency medical volunteers.... It's also a time for our town to get to know each other as neighbors."
