

Solarize Tompkins Is Underway

Solarize Tompkins SE is well underway. Our last informational workshop was on Wednesday, May 29 in the Danby Fire Hall, but our enrollment period does not close until June 15.

Solarize Tompkins is a community initiative, built by inspired volunteers from Danby, Dryden, and Caroline. It uses the power of community purchasing to bring quality products at competitive prices. The competitive bid price for solar electric systems offered to our Solarize Tompkins SE program is 32 percent below the average cost of solar electric in Tompkins County last year.

Our web site, [solarizetompkinsse.org] contains lots of useful information about our community program. It even has sample solar electric and hot water configurations and costs and all the data you'd need to calculate the cost of your own customized installation. We think you'll find that the cash incentives from NY State, along

with both Federal and State tax credits, make the hurdle to solar pretty low.

Taking into account additional discounts (if we achieve community tiered pricing) and government incentives, final costs to homeowners can be about 15 percent of the initial system price. That's about 85 percent off!

Remember, enrollment is nonbinding and free—it simply starts the process of evaluating of your site for a solar system. Your commitment doesn't come until you agree to a design and sign a contract with the installer.

You, too, could be making the sun work for you...this year! \$

Over the past 25 years in Cornell's Department of Astronomy, Rick has served as the Data Manager of the Spacecraft Planetary Imaging Facility, one of NASA's Regional Planetary Image Facilities. During that time, he has collected his favorite images of the Sun, planets, asteroids, and comets that make up our solar system.

Anyone with an interest in the solar system will enjoy this program. Everyone with an eye for the magical beauty of the summer sky should be there!



TOWN CLERK'S DESKTOP

As Town Clerk, I have opted to provide a free Notary Public service. A Notary Public is an appointed (by NY State) public officer with the power to assist citizens by performing a number of official legal and business actions. Most often, this means attesting to the authenticity of signatures. In order to do so, the persons appearing before the notary must be personally known or be able to prove their identity satisfactorily. Recently I have had several calls to assist people this way.



Notary Publics typically perform that service as part of another profession. You'll often find them employed by a bank, in the legal professions, in real estate offices, medical, social, or government service, or practically any other business.

Many Town Clerks are Notaries, although it is not a required part of our duties. A notary's function in town government supports the issuance of grants and bonds, where the signature of the Town Supervisor or another

public officer must be authenticated. A notary can not attest to the authenticity of their own signature, and so any documents signed by the Town Clerk (and requiring authentication) must be witnessed by someone else. I ask one of the Town Justices for this service.

During the past three and a half years, I have provided far more notary services for citizens than I have for government actions. The types of documents I've authenticated included sales agreements, documents related to retirement and/or pension benefits, pistol permits, powers of attorney...and almost any legal document you can imagine. In each case I am serving as a legal witness that the signature is that of the person named in the document, that he or she swears or affirms that he or she has freely and willfully signed the document for the purpose so stated, and/or that the contents of the document are known to them and are that the information is true.

Since the primary service of a notary is to attest to the authenticity of a signature, anyone needing notary services should bring some form of photo identification. Of course, if you're already known and familiar to me, personally, I don't have to see your identification.

When you visit a notary public, you should expect to sign the document in front of the notary. After I have witnessed the signature and administered the affirmation or acknowledgment, I add my own signature and stamp the document with a "seal" that includes my official notary commission number and the date when my commission expires.

A notary's service is really quite limited to a general role: "Swearing that something is true." A notary public may not give advice on the law or draw up any legal papers such as wills, leases, bills of sale, contracts, eviction papers, or powers of attorney. These actions would illegally cross over into an unauthorized practice of law. Notaries, however, may certify the signatures of witnesses or persons named in such documents that have been prepared by an attorney, court, or legal business.

A Notary Public is allowed to charge \$2 per notary service, I have made it a practice to provide the service without charge. I think that this is just part of my job.

As Spring blossoms thru June, the Town Clerk's office will be open 10am-5pm Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. We are closed on Saturdays through August, while summer hours are in effect. As always, the Clerk's is closed on Sundays and Thursdays. And yes, there's still chocolate in the bowl by the Clerk's office window.

COUNTY LEGISLATURE UPDATE

Looking toward 2014, it probably seems early, but the County has begun its budget process already. At our recent budget retreat we discussed the continued effects of the State's pension fund woes, and the impact of Medicaid costs on our County programs and services. Though our tax cap isn't finalized yet, setting a tax levy with the least effect on tax payers while continuing the service delivery will again be a challenge. Dealing with State cutbacks has already impacted the Youth Services, Mental Health, and Health Departments somewhat. Much more discussion will take place, and your guidance is always appreciated.

Please keep abreast of the coming changes precipitated by the Affordable Health Care Act. As of January 2014 each of us will be required to have health insurance, or suffer a financial penalty. Health insurance exchanges are currently being established to help guide residents through the options using program navigators. The Human Services Coalition/Health Planning Council, the Tompkins County Chamber of Commerce, and the Department of Social Services, are positioning for these sites now, but there will be others. It's not too soon to begin exploring options with your employer either. As Health Committee Chairman I'd be happy to try to answer any questions, or guide you to an appropriate resource. On the job development front, meetings have been taking place involving TST-BOCES and Workforce Development to address opportunities in health care. Utilizing the current programs and expanding them to adult education/retraining have some promise, especially with some State support.

Our efforts on the Water Resources Council regarding arresting the hydrilla growth in the inlet and preventing its expansion into Cayuga Lake are paying off. We're planning another treatment this year, and have successfully met with Congressman Tom Reed getting his support for the program. The economic impact on our tourism industry could be devastating in the Finger Lakes if this plant gets established.

Progress on the Courthouse renovations, TCAT, and agricultural focus groups will be topics for next month's newsletter. A big plus is the new County Office for the Aging location at 214 West Martin Luther King Jr./ State St., Human Services Annex. Stop in and visit the next time you are downtown.

H₂O News

Carl and I will be flushing hydrants during the first week of June. To limit any potential negative effect of stirring sediment within the system, we will do it during the late morning in the middle of the week.

On May 8, in the West Danby Fire Station, the Danby Town Board held a public hearing on the progress of the Water District's infrastructure improvements project. There was discussion on leak detection, water quality and conservation, billing, and project management and timing. Thanks to all who attended.

There was also a question about the potential negative health effects associated with exposure to the electromagnetic fields of a remote meter reading system. I was unable to answer the question then, but have done some research since.

The waves we are considering are radio waves in the frequency range of 910-920MHz. That is the same

frequency as garage door openers and operates on the same principle as cordless telephones. I haven't been able to find an instance of someone's health being adversely affected by the exposure.

Both of the companies that are proposing to bid on our project's meters have provided documentation of their compliance with FCC regulations concerning these issues. One of the company's representatives relayed to me an instance where they did not install a remote reader in a household in Johnson City because the homeowner had a legal document drawn up to prohibit it. In that case, the homeowner's son had a neurological disorder and their concern was the radio waves in any frequency were bad. That home did not use cell phones or a cordless telephone, had no garage door openers or any other appliances that operate on radio waves.

It's not a definitive answer to the question but, perhaps, it's useful background information.

SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

If you've ever wondered whether familiar terms like, "a pride of Lions," or, "a string of ponies," were only the tip of the linguistic iceberg, the book, *Exaltation of Larks* provides the definitive answer.

It tells me about: a stoop of elders, a Giggle of girls, a Google of boys, a pluck of firefighters, a prance of equestrians, a rod of fishermen, a wheeze of joggers, an entropy of full professors, and a cuddle of Homecoming Queens.

Yes, the English language is fun and full of surprise and delight. My garden is also weathering surprises, like 26 degrees. The potatoes and pumpkins, just breaking the surface and going for home plate were rocked; I have no idea of what the frost might have done to the fruit trees who are all showing off their new flowers.

Never mind the freeze, where are the bees this year? No bees means questionable pollination. Am I the only one or are others noticing the same lack of these creatures this year?

The Town Hall solar panels are up, but the connection to the Town Hall electrical system will take a little time to complete. Afterward, we will be able to start tracking our monthly billing to get a cost benefit analysis.

We are still fine tuning our biomass boiler, and need another winter to start getting feedback about that system's impact on our energy consumption.

Negotiations with the Tompkins County SPCA are running again, with a hot topic of the present system of revolving dog enumeration for each Town. Similarly, a proposed Cable TV contract with Time Warner, is in the works but, this time around, we will be handing T-W *our* proposal to kick start the talks.

There's no significant visible progress on the Broadband buildout so far this month. We're told that Clarity Connect is hard at work planning the implementation of its project.

We've moved the West Danby water project along with a public meeting, and there's been several meetings with County Youth Services about the future of Youth Programming in towns around he County.

Upgrades to bathrooms and refinishing of the Town Hall floor were discussed during the Town Board meetings in May.

Solarize Tompkins has held informational meetings in Dryden, Caroline, and Danby, and all of them were

well-attended. Dozens of people have indicated interest. The program provides some very good pricing for electric and thermal solar systems. I hope you'll give the idea serious consideration!


