30TH ANNIVERSARY OF FUN DAY

Danby Fun Day is 30 years old this year. Thirty years ago the community (led by the Danby Volunteer Fire Company) felt the need to plan a fun day where neighbors could get together and celebrate a "sense of place." No longer having a neighborhood elementary school had taken its toll on events that included Danby families,

and we were missing those kinds of events.

The first year, 1983, and for years after that, the event was called the Danby Fair. I accepted the position of Fair Organizer, and held that job over the next 15 years. The Bear's Den happily came on board to fix burgers and hot dogs and was always a fun addition to the Fair, as was the Danby Pirates Club and the Flashing Feathers Bow Club. The raffles were a big crowd-pleaser, and included prizes such as dinners, spa visits, a canoe, gift baskets, and even a trip to Aruba, donated by the Wiggins family. Volunteers were sent into the crowd to sell tickets all day long. Leon Oltz always went shopping and bought a nice item to be raffled off. Danby businesses were on board and generous.

The chicken barbecue is hard work for those cooking over those hot fires, but the same volunteers come back every year to do it!



Beautifying Town Hall

Every summertime, I think of my Grandmother. I spent nearly every summer with my grandparents in Hanover, NH. Leland Barbee Hill, my maternal grandmother, taught me many things, one of which was the importance of first impressions.

My grandmother was a Southern Lady (born and raised in Tennessee) who was also the wife of a Dartmouth professor. Even before she greeted people at her door,



an impression was made by the colorful, tidy, and even playful gardens at the entrance of her house. When I arrived for my summer visit, I was made to feel at home with the first sight of the sturdy spruce tree, low creeping shrubs, and colorful pansies and petunias along the walk.

Here at Town Hall, we are doing what we can to create a welcoming and inviting first impression. In many ways, the Town Hall is the community "home" of current and historical of-

ficial activity. It's important that all citizens feel comfortable spending time here, whether it is to attend a town meeting, get the building permits they need, renew their dog licenses, or attend community programs such as concerts and educational presentations. The gardens around the town hall are an important part of a good first impression.

If you visit Town Hall over the summer, you will see several new plantings surrounded by a tidy layer of mulch. Many people have contributed to making things attractive, and I must thank them in this month's "Clerk's Desk" article. First, thanks go to the Danby Highway Department for delivering mulch. This spring, the highway department delivered a truckload from the large pile that has built up near the highway barns on Hornbrook Road. This resource is a by- product of branches collected and chipped through roadside cleanup. FYI, Danby residents may load and carry away mulch for private use during "open hours" at the Highway Department.

Many thanks go to Dave Mastroberti for the major work he has had done on the Town Hall grounds over several years. Dave has been an almost one-man beautification committee, working on plantings around the entrances to the "Danby Hamlet," the Danby Community Park, as well as the Town Hall. Last year, he pruned and tended trees and shrubs near the driveway, improving the appearance of the Town Hall entrance. On behalf of the Bicentennial Committee, he planted a lovely white flowering dogwood not far from the gazebo.

This year Dave has taken on the challenge of the front entrance gardens, which have mostly been filled with a variety of day-lilies and daffodils. He added several native shrubs, providing an elegant variety of height and color to the gardens. Dave also weeded and pruned plantings around the gazebo, gave the flower beds a healthy layer of mulch, and planted some flowering annuals to add yet more color to the gardens.

Final thanks go to Dan Klein and the County Beautification Program. Funds from that program have covered all of Dave Mastroberti's time and materials in replanting the entrance gardens. Over the past few years, Dan has shared "extra" plants from the "Beautification Brigade" increasing the variety of flowering perennials.

> I'm a "plant person" from a long line of outdoors-lovers. So, I take an interest in the care and feeding of the Town Hall gar-

dens. On a nice day, you may well find me outside weeding, watering, or dead- heading the flowers. I also do my best to have a vase of fresh cut flowers at the Town Clerk's counter, from mid-summer through early fall. These touches of beauty help maintain the first impression I want to create, and they help keep a smile on my face while I take care of Town Clerk business...even preparing the Town Board minutes.

BIG PRICE DIFFERENCES AMONG FUNERAL HOMES

Buying a funeral in the southern Finger Lakes region can cost more than twice as much at one funeral home as at another.

A 2013 survey just released by the Funeral Consumers Alliance of the Finger Lakes (FCAFL) shows prices of 14 types of services and two categories of merchandise in 23 municipalities across the region. The price of simple cremation, for example, varies from \$665 to \$3140, plus the crematory fee.

The survey, available at [imsfca.org], has a useful "full-service funeral price index" that can be used to compare the overall price structure at different funeral homes.

The Funeral Consumers Alliance is a non-profit, all-volunteer organization that provides free information about funeral choices, practices, and costs, as well as the rights of funeral consumers. The FCAFL promotes preplanning, but not prepayment, of simple, affordable funeral and memorial arrangements; contact FCAFL at PO Box 134, Ithaca, NY 14850, 607.273.8316, or [info@imsfca.org].

SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

Grapes look good, blueberries are doing their thing, and this will be my first harvest of these fruits. There's also a few pears, a couple of sour cherries but no sweet ones, and apples on some trees but not others. So the freeze that was upon us earlier this Spring, conspired to dent my fruit crop.

The garden, though, is pleased to be feeding us. Great salads and stir fry dishes, the potatoes are looking good and the flowers are wonderful. It's still dry by my count, and watering has begun.

Everybody looking for something to eat this time of year. There were prints in the mud near my pond, and I believe that a bobcat got one of my koi.

It's busy in the town, with lots of things in motion; most have not yet arrived at their destination. Some are getting there, like our annual contract with the Danby Community Council, which should be acted on soon. Maintenance of Town Hall—including floor refinishing—is also on our agenda this month.

The Highway Department will be sharing its truck replacement program with the Town Board in July, the Water District will be starting to install its new water meters, the Town Hall solar collector will soon be connected, and a biomass boiler update is due next month.

Youth services, broadband, and the long-awaited Cable-TV contact with Time-Warner are all ongoing, but not much new to report.

Our aquifer study and follow-up conversations about water in general has also been on our agenda during June. A number of different proposals are being reviewed. The aquifer beheath our feet is shared by many residents of "uphill" Danby and is very important to our lives. We should have something of substance to share with you by this Fall.

I see the organizing Emails leading up on Danby Fun Day are starting to flow. Residents are signing up for different events and activities. Signs and banners announcing this town event are coming soon! I do hope to see many of you there.

WATER TESTING

Water is essential for all aspects of life, and it is natural that residents may have concerns about the quality of their water. Even well-tended water may have occasional problems.

A recent article in the *Ithaca Journal* noted that the Bolton Point water system had high levels of a carcinogenic mineral and samples from the Village of Dryden water system exceeded the federal standard for arsenic. It should be noted that the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for arsenic as only recently revised by the EPA in 2001 and adopted by New York in 2006. Prior to that, the MCL was five times higher than the level considered acceptable today. Both mineral and microbiological may be found naturally in private wells, and be of concern to residents.

Testing for contaminants need not be prohibitively expensive. The arsenic test costs in the range of \$25. A list of water testing labs has been compiled by the Tompkins County Health Department, Division of Environmental Health. The following labs, located in Ithaca, are certified to test for microbiological quality and inorganic minerals and metals in water supplies. Full contact information for an additional seven labs is also available, some of which are more limited in the materials they may test for.

The testing labs can provide you with information, sampling instructions and containers as well as the desired analyses.

More information about water testing labs may be obtained from the Tompkins County Health Department, Division of Environmental Health. A copy of the water testing labs list is also available from the Danby Town Clerk's office, 1830 Danby Road, Ithaca NY 14850 or [townclerk@town.danby.ny.us].


