### THE CANDIDATES SPEAK!

How to sort out who is best for each position? One good way is to have them assemble in one room and hear their statements and answers to questions submitted by potential voters.

We are pleased to be able to offer just this opportunity at a Candidates Forum on Sunday October 20, 2-3:45pm, in the West Danby Fire Hall. All candidates for the contested positions of County Legislature (Danby/Caroline Representative), Town Supervisor, Town Councilperson, and Town Clerk have been invited to participate in this moderated forum.

With this many candidates, the format will necessarily be formal, where each candidate gives a short opening statement about themselves and their qualifications,

experience, and desire to run. Questions will then be taken from the audience on 3x5 cards, to be read by the moderator, as many as time allows (similar questions may be combined). The candidates will each have a chance for a one-minute response. Finally, each candidate will give a short closing statement.

Happily, we have secured the services of Kay Sharp, President of the Tompkins County League of Women Voters, to serve as moderator. Kay is an Ithaca resident and has moderated similar events in the past.


## Town Clerk's Desktop

#### **Budget Time**

Apples! If only we could run the Town on apples. This year is turning out to be a spectacular apple harvest. I've already canned dozens of quarts of applesauce and I'm cooking apples into everything I can imagine. Unfortunately, apples can't be the core of our Town's budget.

I'm happy to realize that some years of experience pro-



vide a better understanding of what we need, what we can do without, and what we can expect for the next year. It's not so different from what each of us does for our home budgets. We take a careful look at what we need, conserve as much as possible, and hope for solid reserves to carry us into the future.

The Town Board is responsible for three of the four sections of the Town Budget: the General Fund, the Highway Fund, and the West Danby Water District budget. By NYS law, the fourth section, the Fire District budget, is prepared and

passed by the Fire Commissioners; the Fire levy passes directly to your tax bill.

The Water District budget includes funds to pay the Water Commissioners and all fees related to the upkeep of the West Danby Water District. The Highway Fund includes most of the budget lines related to the care and maintenance of our roads. The General Fund includes everything else.

We are looking towards a 2014 budget for the Town Clerk's office and Town Hall that will be as similar as possible compared to recent years. We're adjusting numbers to reflect real need, to keep taxes level. Hours and wages for myself and my support staff will be kept at an appropriate level. I appreciate the flexibility and efficiency of Mary Ann Barr (Records Assistant) and Sue McLellan (Deputy Clerk) and the willingness of other Town staff to be creative about sharing work between offices. We've actually been able to reduce, or eliminate, budget lines in some areas.

The Town Board has set several extra meetings dedicated to budget review and planning. Meetings (all in the Danby Town Hall meeting room) are set for 7:30pm on October 7, 6pm on October 14 and 21 (prior to the regularly scheduled meetings), and 6:30pm on October 29.

The Preliminary budget should be made available for public review at the end of October, either online at [town.danby.ny.us] or via the Town Clerk's office. A formal Budget Hearing, when residents may offer verbal comment on the budget and the Town Board will vote on its adoption, is scheduled for 6:30pm on November 7. The Town Clerk is responsible for assuring that the meetings are publicized, open to all, and for keeping a record of the process.

The Town Clerk works in cooperation with the Town Bookkeeper, the Town Board, and others to prepare the budget for the next fiscal year. This is very much a team effort. While the Town Board sets policy and the bookkeeper does most of the financial figuring, the Town Clerk is responsible for recording and maintaining a record of the budget for each year. Preliminary and final versions of each annual budget are available through the Clerk's office.

Residents have a part they can play by attending budget review meetings, becoming informed about the financial health of the town, and making concerns known. Residents can prepare written comments or can speak directly to the Town Board during a Public Hearing. Either way, it's pretty informal and informative for all who attend.

Information and history about the Danby budget can be found at the Town web site. PDF versions of the budget for the past three years are located at the very bottom of the "Town Board" page, [town.danby.ny.us/TownBoard]. Scroll all the way down and you will find them there.

## COUNTY LEGISLATURE UPDATE

The County budget season has begun! County Administrator Joe Mareane reports that his recommendation, after working with the Departments and Agencies, reflects a maintenance of services mode yielding a proposed tax levy of 3.54% and a rate change of 1.92%--a \$21 increase on an average home assessing at \$163,000.

Dealing with concerns and needs at Tompkins Cortland Community College, the Public Library, Tompkins County Area Development, and Tompkins Consolidated Area Transit (TCAT) allprovided some challenges, but were able to be incorporated into his proposal. The Expanded Budget Committee will be hearing Department presentations next and these meetings are open should you like to attend. The Budget Proposal is online for review at [tompkins-co.org]; click on "County Budget."

Please forward your comments and suggestions to me, as I appreciate your input. The additional request from Youth Services has been recommended!

Regarding taxes: if you received a letter regarding the Basic Star Exemption, please be sure you re-apply! Your exemption will be lost otherwise. Also, the Health Exchange will be available starting in October. You can discuss your needs with a "navigator" by calling the Human Services Coalition, 607.273.8686. or the Chamber of Commerce 607.273.7080 to set an appointment.

The first year of Care Transitions Program was successful. Helping patients being discharged from the hospital manage the move regarding medications, recovery, and reduced re-admissions is proving to be a plus. The

partners in this program are Cayuga Medical Center, the County Office for the Aging, Visiting Nurse Service, and Hospicare. Their commitment has been very well received by the community.

Our review of the compensatory time practice extended to our management staff showed that Tompkins County was the only entity of those twelve counties, four cities, Cornell University, and Ithaca College surveyed that permitted accumulated time to be paid when an individual left County employment. The County recognizes the important role the management class plays in achieving County goals, and did not want to impact those under the current policy, but the Task Force recommended that the time be taken during employment and not be paid as a lump sum at severance. While the practice of paying for hours worked in excess of a management employee's normal work is entirely legal, it is not required. All agreed to keep the dialogue open on this topic.

Recognizing the important economic role agriculture plays in the County, the recent help from Senator Charles Schumer in getting the dairy industry recognized here was very appreciated. Knowing the roles the other segments of that industry play, not only locally, but in the State, will continue to bring a positive focus on the whole industry, and help sustain it. The Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board will be a major voice in this effort.

## SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

This morning, as I write, I'm looking at the results of our first frost. It's unclear what survived in the garden, but we've had a clear signal that we have moved into Fall.

In Town Hall, our first board meeting on the newly refinished floor was held on September 16. We discussed the Time-Warner franchise agreement, had an update on Youth Service budgeting, set dates for workshops on the 2014 Town budget, and talked about the property tax cap (we're well under it) and how the Affordable Care Act would impact current insurance costs.

We also received a report on the current status of the Town budget: healthy fun balances, and expenses within estimates.

My big take-away homework was the feedback we had about the proposed Time-Warner franchise agreement. The concerns were passed on to the county-wide group preparing a template agreement, and some of it will be specific to our local contract. These include:

- dissatisfaction with signal strength; presently T-W does not realistically take account of the distance to many houses receiving its service, and the distance from the poles to those houses
- slow speeds on their Internet connection, due to rural residences (that's Danby!) being the end users in the pipeline
- an apparent requirement that multiple subscribers have to report a problem (critical mass) before any action will be taken
- the switch from analog to digital; T-W has added a new fee for the rental of signal converter boxes
- changes to the assignment of channels to service tiers. For example, government access channels that moved from basic to a higher-cost optional tier.

Buildout for Time-Warner—adding cable and equipment to new neighborhoods—is expensive. The current formula for buildout is thwarted by gaps—state land, parks, ponds, gorges—that separate housing clusters. In consideration for rural towns, the countywide committee may revise the proposed language down to from 20 to 12 per mile.

It is unclear to me at this point how much of the utility provided by Time-Warner could be covered by Broadband Internet but, as I said at our Board meeting, if residents feel that a cable connection is what they want, they should let me know.

Do you have other Time-Warner concerns? If you'd like to add to the list, please Email them to me or give me a call!

Speaking of broadband, it is in the pipeline. Construction will begin later this year.

# Solar Panels at Town Hall

Driving past the Danby Town Hall this summer you've probably seen the new solar photovoltaic array out in the lawn to the north of the building.

We get two main questions up here about the system, namely, "What's the capacity of those panels?" and "How much of my taxes are going towards paying for that?" Easy to answer.

It's a 21.4 kW system, sized to meet the historical electrical demand of our building over the course of a year. What's more, none of your taxes were or will be spent.

It's a leased system, and a year's worth of lease payments of \$110/month are guaranteed to be less than the amount we would have paid to NYSEG for electricity. The net result is a savings to the town, and to the taxpayer. Also, since we don't actually own the system, we're not responsible for its operating or maintenance costs.

While many homeowners purchase their solar systems and get significant tax credits in doing so, a municipality would get none of those credits...so leasing makes sense.

## RE-REGISTER FOR NYS STAR PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

Excerpt of a letter from Jay Franklin, County Tax Assessor

The state of NY is making all 2.7 million Basic STAR recipients re-register by November 30 of of this year. In Tompkins County, about 19,500 recipients are affected.

Seniors receiving "Enhanced STAR" exemptions aren't affected by this change, but must continue to apply annually.

The Tompkins County Assessment office will have very limited ability to answer questions or register people outside of the online application. The phone number at the State to call is 518.457.2036.

#### Advanced Notice for 2014

Have you ever thought about getting more involved in local government? It's not too soon to think about Town appointments for 2014.

The Danby Town Board will seek applications for several Boards, including a seven-year term on the Planning Board, five-year terms on the Board of Zoning Appeals and the West Danby Board of Water Commissioners, two-year terms on the Conservation Advisory Council, and a two-year term representing Danby on the Environmental Management Council. Two seats open for one-year terms on a Board of Assessment Review. The Town Board will also review applications for persons interested in serving as Town Historian, a one-year term.

#### **Immediate Need for Applicants**

The Danby Town Board is seeking applications *right now* to replace immediate vacancies on the Board of Zoning Appeals and the Tompkins County Environmental Management Council.

The Town of Danby has been without a representative to the County EMC since Bill Halton resigned his two-year term to become a Commissioner of the Danby Fire District. The Town is also seeking a replacement for Al Wagner's position on the Board of Zoning Appeals. The BZA term runs through the end of 2015.

The Town of Danby is sad to lose Al Wagner as Chair of the Board of Zoning Appeals. Al served on the BZA for several years, with careful thought and consideration as to how the needs and desires of property owners can be in balance with the long term good of the town. Al resigned from the BZA to pursue an MBA. He has received a scholarship for these studies and has a heavy course load to manage in addition to his business as a property appraiser.

Applications for these positions are due on October 11.

## BROADBAND IN DANBY UPDATE

With Fall already here, winter is just around the corner, and some of us are thinking of curling up near the wood stove with ice cream and a good web browser. How fast will those pages load?

It's been several months since the NYS broadband grant award to a local business, Clarity Connect, was announced. What's been happening? Here's a summary of info from the Tompkins County Broadband Committee, occasional conversations with Clarity and some of Clarity's prospective customers, and even what I hope are good guesses.

You can imagine the mound of paperwork and ground-work needed to bootstrap the project, as well as the unexpected obstacles. Work on the first towers—there are a very small number of traditional, tall towers and approximately 60 small, telephone-pole towers—was expected to begin in late September. Clarity will be learning just how fast it can install and equip the telephone poles. They expect to be able to bring two or three poles online per week. Danby will have somewhat less than ten poles—not towers—out of the total of about sixty.

During October, work will concentrate on the construction of a traditional, tall tower west of Ithaca. That tower will directly serve part of Danby and relay to other parts via poles. Pole work will resume when the big tower is ready, perhaps by November.

The big question for everyone is, which towers and poles should be brought online first? The most efficient approach is to base the decision primarily on the density of people who have signed up for service—the more that have registered in a given area, the sooner its service pole will be brought online...but with some allowance for low density areas (like Danby). In other words, an area that has 15 people with everyone signed up might get put in before an area with 60 households but only 20 signed up.

Lansing and Genoa have the highest densities, but Danby isn't far behind. It's possible that installations in our town will begin in November or December. Clarity hopes to put a "project status" page on its web site. Even allowing for the weather, Clarity expects the project to be 100% operational by next June.
