TOWN CLERK'S DESKTOP

Summertime is a good time in Town Hall and in the Town Clerk's office. Our usual work (renewing dog licenses, issuing handicap parking permits, creating meeting minutes, and helping to keep track of Town records and finances) seems a little more lighthearted...a little more fun.

Part of that fun is helping Danby's Rural Youth Program manager, Karlita Bleam, with scheduling fun-filled pro-



gramming. We get together each season to confirm dates for programs and to assure that the needs of all Town Hall users are met: youth programs, library volunteers and users, court cases, and (of course) staff and public meetings. Our goal is to provide a safe and useful space for youth activities while making sure that there are no conflicts with other events in the Town Hall. Throughout July and August, the Town Hall is a hub for indoor crafts and play workshops and outdoor field trips for Danby youth.

Karlita gave an informative presentation to the Town Board during its second June meeting. She let the Board know that many of her programs are inspired by Danby youth themselves. Most take place in the Danby Town Hall or in Dotson Park, across the road. Some of the summer's programming will happen in Jennings Pond Park. We're even working out the logistics for a *Growing Girl's Group* sleepover in the vicinity of the Town Hall.

All of the youth programs are designed to promote positive youth development through diverse relationships with adults and other youth, learning life skills, and contributing to the community. Details of this summer's programs can be found on the *Youth Pages* at the back of the DAN. I especially look forward to watching Danby youth contribute to the Fun Day celebration on July 12. Prior to the event, they will design, create, and test games and crafts for younger kids to enjoy during Fun Day. The youth program participants will also be riding in a parade float. Keep an eye out for them!

Preparing for Danby Fun Day is some of the most joyous work we do. In June, the Town board was happy to undertake its annual tradition: approving a resolution to close NYS Rt.96B for the Fun Day Parade. Route 96B will be closed from roughly 10:30am until Noon. Normally, there is a detour around the closed section that shifts traffic to Comfort Road. This year, due to the closure of Bald Hill Road by the Tompkins County Highway Department (June 30-July 24), the Fun Day detour will be a lot longer, via East Miller Road, Nelson Road, Durfee Hill Road, and Steam Mill Road. This detour is only for the few hours during the Parade.

During July, the Town Clerk's office will be open 10am-5pm Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. We are closed on Saturday, Sunday, and Thursday. The Summer hours, which drop Saturday mornings, started on Memorial Day weekend and run thru the Labor Day weekend. If there is a special need, though, we will make arrangements to serve you by appointment on Saturdays. You can always reach us by phone, 607.277.4788.

Summer is is here! In celebration, not only is the candy bowl will be filled with chocolate kisses, but there are fresh flowers blooming at the Town Hall entrance and in vases on the Town Clerk's counter.

West Danby Water District Update Submitted by Tod Sukontarak, Water Commissioner

We are doing the detail work to prepare for the construction of our new water tank by Statewide Aquastore.

In the last month, we've exercised all the line valves in the system, identified the new flushing hydrant locations, and consulted with Westbrook Enterprises to evaluate the condition of the electrical circuits to the tank.



I don't know the exact construction start date but it is in the near future. Our deadline for project completion is October 30, 2014.

One job I still have to complete is installing new meters in each household in the district. There are six outstanding. I've left

notes on doors or communicated in other ways with each of those people and will continue to pester until we've got a new meter in every residence in the water district.

As a result of my inability to get them all changed by this time, Marge Seamon and I won't be able to get the training for our new billing software in time to use it for the July meter reading. Ś

BALD HILL ROAD CLOSED NEAR CORNER OF NYS RT.96B

During the third week in June, the Tompkins County Highway Division announced that it will be closing Bald Hill Road during July, for culvert repairs.

Bald Hill Road will be closed near its bend, close to the intersection with NYS Rt.96B, from June 30 (6am) through approximately July 24 (4:30pm). The TCHD press release added that these dates are approximate.

Residents south and/or west of the closure are advised to plan sufficient additional travel time to follow the detour.

SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

Welcome to this month's Danby Area News.

Danby is working on a draft water information and aquifer protection law. The Town partnered with the U.S. Geological Survey and Tompkins County in a study of the Upper Buttermilk Creek/Danby Creek Aquifer. Last January, the Town Board passed a resolution that the Town intends to participate in the New York Rural Water Association's Source Water Protection Program.

The Town has been fortunate to be able to work with Steven Winkley, a Water Resources Specialist with the New York Rural Water Association. A proposal for groundwater protection overlay zone boundaries (that is, an overlay to the existing zoning map) will be presented to the Board and there will be information sessions for the public sometime later this year.

According to Winkley, "I wanted to give you an update that I am very close to completing a draft of the Groundwater Protection Local Law that we discussed at our last meeting. If you recall, we decided that we would adopt town-wide prohibitions to protect the groundwater resources of the entire Town. This list is generally similar to the previous draft. However, we also discussed having an overlay zone to protect key recharge areas that have been highlighted in the USGS studies. These areas would have additional safeguards. I have coined this, the Stratified-Drift Aquifer Recharge (SDAR) Overlay Zone."

DIME TOSS NEEDS TARGET/PRIZE GLASSES Submitted by Sharon Gaden

The Dime Toss, a perennial favorite at Danby Fun Day, is also one of the events' oldest games. It was played 31 years ago at the very first Danby Fair/Fun Day.

The dime toss features new and old (but always unique) glassware that fills a dual purpose: target and prize. Toss a dime into any glass; if it stays inside, you win a piece of glassware!

There have been a lot of winners over the years, and the Dime Toss is looking for additional glassware for players to try for! Ś Some of this work, going on three years now, has turned up additional information and I am sharing it with you.

During a recent meeting of the Tompkins County Council of Governments seeking information to pass on to the EPA, I asked what information on Arsenic and Radon they might share with Municipalities. So far, I have learned that,

- Tompkins County is classified by the US EPA as a Zone 1 County, which means that homes in Tompkins are expected to have radon levels greater than 4 pCi/L. Here is a link that may be useful: [www.epa.gov/radon/].
- The County Health Department has no authority to set radon standards. The EPA has set 4 pCi/L as an action level. Everyone living in a Zone 1 county should test his or her home. Contractors proficient in radon mitigation can be found at: [www.nrpp.info/mitigation template/NY.shtml].
- Information on what should be in a radon mitigation contract:

BUS VS. CAR: REAL COSTS

If you're thinking about buying a car or taking the bus a little more often, here are some figures to help you make a decision.

AAA has published some costs of driving a car in 2014. The averages for a medium sedan are \$0.592 per mile to drive and \$8,876 costs per year. This includes fuel costs, tire costs, insurance and depreciation.

According to these figures, it will cost you \$5.92 per trip to Ithaca (about 10 miles from my house), or \$11.84 per round trip.

The Ithaca Carshare web site offers similar information: \$9,122 for a medium sedan, but \$11,599 for an SUV. This includes the same costs as the AAA estimates.

How does that compare to the cost of the bus? For rural routes like Danby, a 1-14 ride TCAT card costs \$2.50/ ride and a 15+ ride card costs \$2.25 per ride. For seniors and youth under 18, the costs are much less (\$1.25 per ride). Little children, 5 years old and under, are free.

The schedule for the Danby bus (Route 65) and how to get from here to there, are on TCAT's web site, [tcat-bus.com]. You can also call them at 607.277.RIDE.

For those of you who don't know about Ithaca Carshare, I will talk about it at another time. It's basically a program to use a car intermittently, and pay for only for that use. Here's what they say on their website: "The average car owner spends \$760 per month to finance, fuel, insure, and maintain their vehicle. The average Ithaca Carshare member spends around \$100 per month."

It's worth thinking about, especially if things are tight in your budget. There is a program out of Tompkins County Cooperative Extension called *Way-2-Go* that I will try to research and write about this summer, which gives you some options other than these two for travel to and from where you need to go.

The kitchen will also have hot dogs, hamburgers, sausage, veggie burgers, salt potatoes, and grilled onions and peppers.

The West Danby Fire Department will be selling ice cream. We hope to also have popcorn and cotton candy to satisfy your sweet tooth. And don't forget to stop at the Cake Wheel to bring some of the sweetness home with you!
