# Town Clerk's Desktop

Six more weeks of winter? Four more? Eight more? This winter has been a challenge. I would like to predict that March will bring more sunshine, less snow, and warmer temperatures. I would like to predict that...but I'm not sure that my prediction would be accurate. Let's all hope that, however it arrives and whatever the month brings, March goes out like a lamb.

Although the bitter cold and blowing snow has persisted through February, tax collection has slowed to its

normal post-Janaury drip. The majority of all Danby Town and Tompkins County taxes were collected by February 2, so only a few property owners will need to pay the penalty of 1 percent per month that is added to outstanding tax bills.

As a reminder, we collect property tax through the end of March. After that, all payments including installment payments are due by July 1, 2015 and are paid to the Tompkins County Division of Finance, 125 East Court Street, Ithaca.

Now that Deputy Clerk Sue McClellan and I are not handling lots of checks and making daily trips to the bank, we are able to catch up on record-keeping and communication. Next to tax collection, these are the most important jobs of the Town Clerk's office.

Various special issues this winter (the Hornbrook Road indident, a proposed change to the Planned Development Zone on Gunderman Road, final work on the West Danby Water District system, remediations to the Highway Department's wood boiler heating system, and ongoing work on a proposed Aquifer Protection Ordinance) have added to the importance and volume of work this winter. The basics of digging out, getting to work, and keeping warm have only added to the challenge.

The Town Clerk's office team—Sue, Records Assistant Mary Ann Barr, and myself—are all doing our best to keep up with the paperwork. Sometimes, especially when a piece of information is needed right away, it's tough to meet the high standards we like to maintain. We continue to have Town documents created in a timely manner, organized sensibly, and accessible when questions need answers.

While there is always more that can be done, we are seeing improvements. Important records from the Water

District are now in a safe place and are being organized. Gradually, electronic copies of records from the Code Enforcement and Clerk's offices are being added to the TSSERR/Laserfiche system. These copies will serve as a backup in case of a disaster at Town Hall.

The news has broken that the Tompkins County Shared Services Electronic Records Repository (TSSERR) was recognized by the The Ash Center for Democratic Governance and Innovation at John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University as a "Bright Idea" in innovative government action. Credit for this municipal shared services records program goes to Tompkins County Clerk, Maureen Reynolds. As she says, "Unlike larger governments, small local governments in New York State often do not have the resources to implement and support high-level uses of technology within their records management programs. Often, the best alternative is to pool resources and collaborate with other like governments, in order to provide access to technological efficiencies and eliminate redundancies."

"The Bright Ideas program demonstrates that often seemingly intractable problems can be creatively and capably tackled by small groups of dedicated, civicminded individuals," said Stephen Goldsmith, director of the Innovations in Government Program at the Ash Center.

Many of the records archived this way will, eventually, be made accessible through the Town of Danby web site. I have heard frustration from some residents that they can't find information on the new web site as quickly as they would like. Please, be patient with us while we continue to work through a time of transition.

The new system has benefits, such as automatic archiving of official Town Email...but it also has some limitations. A Communications Committee (including a Town Board member, the Town Clerk, and the web master) are working to find solutions to some of the problems inherent in any new system.

From March through mid-May, the Town Clerk's office is open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, 10am-5pm, and 10am-Noon on Saturdays. As always, we are closed on Sundays and Thursdays, and there are chocolate kisses in the candy bowl.

# WEST DANBY WATER DISTRICT UPDATE

The Water Commissioners looked at the available options for repairing the water coming into the pump house and decided on a solution. We are going to go to a submersible pump rather than the turbine shaft pump we had been using.

The submersible pump takes about a quarter of the time to install so will allow us to do a well-cleaning while the pump is offline. Moody and Associates is ordering the parts we need and will be replacing a gate and check valve and doing some masonry work while installing the pump and cleaning

the well. Right now, we don't have a date scheduled for this to begin but it could be as soon as February 23.

Due to the excessively long and extreme cold we have had this winter, there have been many frozen pipes in Water District residences. I am having some problem with the cold in my basement too. It is the homeowner's responsibility to keep their water meter from freezing. The district

will replace frozen water meters at cost to the homeowner where necessary.

## COUNTY LEGISLATURE UPDATE

This month I want to write about some newly-protected land in Danby, with a detour through tax foreclosure procedures.

The Finger Lakes Land Trust has added an additional 30 acres to the existing Lindsay-Parson Biodiversity Preserve in West Danby. This brings the total area of the preserve to 537 acres. The preserve is open to the public.

The Land Trust made the purchase of the mostly wetlands site from a private landowner. They used funds from several sources, including \$10,000 from the Tompkins County Capital Reserve Fund for Natural, Scenic, and Recreational Resource Protection.

This County fund was established by the Tompkins County Legislature in 2005. The money from the fund largely comes from the sale of certain foreclosed properties.

When a property owner in Tompkins County doesn't pay their taxes, the County goes through a series of steps over a several year period to collect that money. The goal is to collect the tax money owed while also working with the landowner so that they can hold on to their property. The overwhelming number of these instances are worked out so that both things happen--the taxes are paid and the landowner retains their land.

Sometimes that is not the case and the County must foreclose. In those cases, the property is sold and the money is used to reimburse the County for its taxes as

well as for the Town, Village, and School Taxes that the County has already paid out to those municipalities to make them whole.

METER

Occasionally, a foreclosed property is deemed to have significant environmental qualities, in which case a special effort is made to preserve these qualities. A typical example of this kind of situation would be a foreclosed property bordering a state park; it may be withheld from foreclosure auction and then sold to New York State Parks to serve as a buffer to the park.

In these special circumstances, the money from the sale (after past taxes are paid) is placed into the Tompkins County Capital Reserve Fund for Natural, Scenic, and Recreational Resource Protection. The purpose of this fund is to support participation by Tompkins County in partnerships with other levels of government and private organizations to protect and preserve natural, scenic, and recreational resources; preserve and develop recreational trail corridors that cross municipal borders; and develop outdoor recreation facilities that are intended to serve all County residents. Using some of this fund to add on to protected land in West Danby is the perfect use for this money.

The County foreclosed on twelve properties in 2014. Eleven of those properties were sold at auction and one was pulled on recommendation of the Planning Department and Tompkins County Legislature after being tagged as having a community conservation benefit.

Our wood boiler project at the Highway Department Barns is still pending in the wings; I look forward to some kind of resolution on this issue later this year.

It is a tough time of the year to be cheerful. Cabin fever is said to be alive and well in Danby. I try and tell myself to be of good cheer; better weather is coming. I'm sure. Really sure.

# Drinking Water Supply Survey

In order to help protect the availability and quality of our drinking water resources, the Town of Danby is working with the New York Rural Water Association (NYRWA) on a source water protection plan. The purpose of such a plan is to reduce or eliminate the potential risks to drinking water supplies. An initial step in the development of this plan is to collect information on the nature of water supply issues here in Danby.

As part of the effort to better understand water supply resources in Danby, NYRWA has created an online drinking water supply survey at [surveymonkey.com/s/DMCRWC6]. In addition, there is a link to this survey on the Town's web site [townofdanbyny.org].

Your help in our effort to protect the drinking water of Danby would be greatly appreciated. Our hope is that you can spend a few minutes and complete the water supply survey. Responses to this survey will be confidentially sent to NYRWA, a non-profit organization of small communities and rural water/wastewater systems in New York State. They hope to collect the responses to this survey by February 28, 2015. Thank you very much for your assistance.

# CARBON MONOXIDE: THE INVISIBLE KILLER

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas that can cause sudden illness and death. Don't be a statistic! Be aware and be prepared! CO is undetectable to the human senses.

#### What is it and where does it come from?

Carbon monoxide is produced by the incomplete burning of various fuels, including coal, wood, charcoal, natural gas, propane, kerosene, and oil. There are well over 400 deaths in the US each year from accidental CO poisoning. Leading causes of CO poisoning are faulty, improperly used, or incorrectly vented fuel burning appliances (furnace, stove, water heater, fireplace, etc.).

#### Know the symptoms!

The health effects of CO depend on the concentration, the length of exposure, and the health of the individual. Early symptoms include flu-like symptoms, headache, nausea, fatigue, and shortness of breath. High level symptoms include mental confusion, loss of muscular coordination, vomiting, loss of consciousness, and death.

#### How can you keep yourself safe?

- Have working CO detectors properly installed. Contact the Town Code Enforcement office for detailed information on the requirements for detectors.
- Never ignore the CO alarm. Do not try to find the source. Move outside and call 911.
- Have fuel burning appliances inspected and serviced regularly.
- Do not use a portable gas powered generator inside or in an enclosed space. Do not use a charcoal grill or a propane gas grill indoors. Do not use a gas range or oven to heat your house.

Remember, CO is undetectable to the human senses. Don't be a statistic! Be aware and be prepared!
