THE TOWN BOARD of the Town of Danby invites residents to apply now for volunteer municipal boards seats starting January 2019. Your involvement is welcome and needed.

Each year, one seat opens on each of the Planning Board (7-year term) and the Board of Zoning Appeals (5-year term). The Planning Board meets on 3rd Thursdays to reviews subdivisions and development applications. The Board of Zoning Appeals meets as needed (often 4th Tuesday) to hear and decide variance requests related to the Zoning Ordinance. The 2-year terms of several Conservation Advisory Council members are ending. The CAC advises the Board in the development, management, and protection of the Town's natural resources. The full charge of the CAC, is available in the Town Clerk's office. The West Danby Water Commissioners have at least one vacancy.

Town Clerk's office. This simple form includes contact information for the applicant and three simple questions: any experience (professional, educational, etc.) that would assist in the position, a brief description of why you would like to be considered, and what you would hope to accomplish in this position.

WANT TO WATCH THE MOON GET EATEN? Sunday, January 20, 2019 is a special day for sky gazers. The total eclipse of the moon, will be fully visible over Danby. It's not too late at night and the next day is a national holiday so many of us have no work and no school. PS: unlike solar eclipses, there's no danger in watching the moon turn red.

The Community Council has invited Zeo Learner Ponterio, a genuine scientist from Cornell's Spacecraft Planetary Imaging Facility, to talk about pictures from space and, in particular, lunar eclipses. She'll bring photos galore to Town Hall at 3pm on January 20. Our Moon is practically backyard ballistics for Zoe.

Later, in the evening, we'll be out in Dotson Park with eyeballs, binoculars, and telescopes. Simon Wyatt has offered to share views thru his 130mm Newtonian reflector, and we're hoping that more folks will volunteer high-powered optics.



Property Tax Collection

I write this every year, and it still is true. The cruel month of January is upon us. We barely get over the indulgences of holiday parties and staying up late for New Year's Eve when reality hits us. There is no escape from Cold, Dark, or Taxes. It's hard to tell whether 2019 will be especially cold, and snowy—but there is no question that January continues to be dark. In these times, it seems that the only thing that will get us through are twinkly lights and massive amounts of chocolate.

Tax bills were sent out in December, and should be in



your mail box by the first week of January. If, for some reason you do not receive your Town and County property tax bill on time (January 7 or 8), please call us right away. We can print out and send a duplicate bill. Please note that if your taxes are paid by an escrow service, the original bill is sent to the bank or payment service. If there has been a change in your escrow status and the bill should come to you, let us know. Again, we can print out a duplicate copy and send it to you right away.

The first day for property tax collection in 2019 is Tuesday January 2. This year, the final day (January 31) to pay taxes without a penalty, or to pay with the installment option falls on a Thursday. For taxpayer convenience, the Town Clerk's office *will* be open that day. The office will be closed all other Thursdays in January, but will have extended hours every Saturday, 10am1pm.

Property tax collection continues through February and March, with monthly interest penalties. Cash and checks are accepted, but not credit cards.

Please remember, Town Clerks are only tax collectors. We don't set your assessment or the tax rate. In fact, we face the same "tax pain" as all of the rest of the property owners in Danby. This is the first tax collection season for Deputy Clerk, Alex Pfeifer. Be kind to her. We know that there's little we can do to relieve the darkness and stress of January but, we can promise that the candy bowl will be filled with chocolate kisses—including plenty of dark chocolate. Thanks to the generosity of the "loose change chocolate fund," there will be plenty for all.

January Organizational Business

January also the time to reset business for another year. A chunk of that kind of business takes place during the Town Board's "Organizational Meeting" on January 7. A block of several dozen resolutions are passed to cover items like approval of salaries, methods of fiscal reporting and paying bills, reauthorization of the procurement policy and authorization for the Highway Department to purchase tools and equipment, and other approvals to enable Highway to spend funds on road repairs.

During the meeting, the Town Board sets its annual meeting schedule, declares the official bank depositories, and its newspaper of record for publication of legal notices. These mundane resolutions make it possible for the town to continue business in a orderly and organized manner.

January Hours

During January Tax Collection, January 2 through 31, the Town Clerk's office will be open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Fridays 10am-5pm, and Saturday mornings, 10am-1pm. We will be open Thursday January 31 for the final day of installment payment and tax collection with no added penalties. Saturday hours return to 10am-Noon in the month of February. We are closed on Sundays and Thursdays.

Informed Delivery... or Disaster?

WE'VE ALL HEARD TOO MUCH about Fake News these days, but I recently read articles about something that's as real as Identity Theft: a new program offered by the United States Postal Service, called *Informed Delivery*. I'll summarize my own experience and the warnings I've read, so you can make an informed decision.

With the explosive growth of services offered via the Internet, it was only a matter of time before someone had a great idea: Why not tell postal customers what to expect in their mailbox every day? Well, the marketing geniuses at USPS had that idea. When you sign up for the Informed Delivery service, you get Email every morning with pictures of the front side of every piece of mail that will be delivered to you later in the day (well, sometimes a lot later, and sometimes only some of the pieces, but that's another story).

Sounds too good to be true, right? What a gift! It takes all the guesswork and uncertainty out of receiving mail. Now I don't have to walk out to the mailbox unless something important is waiting for me. In fact, if someone promised, "The check's in the mail," I will know that it's not...several hours earlier than before!

The problem is, those marketing geniuses didn't notice that there is no reasonable way for me to guarantee that I'm me. The key words are *reasonable* and *guarantee*. Let me explain by describing what happens if I'm not me; that is, if someone (presumably, someone who does not have my best interests at heart) requests notifications about *my* mail. In short, the USPS tells *someone*

else that something valuable is arriving and my mailbox gets emptied before I get to it. See the problem?

This is not so much an issue when mailboxes are locked or behind locked doors, or when they are supervised (see: urban). It's a real problem when mail is delivered to an open box on a lonely road (see: Danby).


The USPS implemented two different, simple ways to prove that I'm me, and both of them are easily circumvented. First, the customer can ask the USPS to mail a secret code, which is then entered via the web. Obviously, a third party can request and then intercept *that* mail, too.

Second, a customer can answer a few simple questions—on the web, naturally—about previous mail history. I've gone through that process twice now; once, it didn't accept my correct answers, and the other time it worked, but all the correct answers could have been found using internet searches. Sigh.

I can think of several *unreasonable* ways to prove identity, but the USPS isn't using them...and probably would not use them because they involve significant manual intervention on both my part and its part.

So, owners of mailboxes—particularly rural mailboxes—are faced with two or three choices: ① sign up for the service before someone else does (that's what I did), ② tell the USPS that you're opting-out of he service (I couldn't find any way to do this but maybe you'll do better), or ③ take your chances.

THIS MONTH'S NEWS UPDATE includes the culmination of projects outlined by me in past articles.


All of the grant funding requests we submitted for flood mediation were approved. This is good news for the Town in a number of ways. Serous infrastructure concerns are being funded by outside sources, with no matching money is required from the Town. This allows hundred of thousands of dollars of Town money to be funneled back into the rest of our roads for maintenence.

The grant contract from NYSERDA also arrived. It funds a wash bay and salt recycling machinery, and a new building to house it in. This will mean we have tied up the ongoing salt issue. The building will cover our salt storage and the recycling of wash bay salt. Also with this grant we have the go-ahead to install new garage doors and heat pumps to reduce our energy use at Highway, and to finish up other projects like a shed to cover our gas pumps.

Moving down the list, the pedestrian pad for our new park-and-ride shelter (in the park, opposite Town Hall) is poured and awaiting the shelter itself. Big thank you to Paul Hansen and the Highway Department, for this effort. The charging station, and new garden planeters

The news that really makes me—and, I hope you—feel better is the completion of a full audit of the Town finances. We got an "A". This is the bedrock of my responsibility to you. All other things aside, the fact that we have commissioned and survived an audit is a big deal for us. It has been on our agenda for some time; it's a lot of work for staff and there never seems like there's enough time to ask them to take on this additional work.

An audit means opening our doors wide for an independent look at how your money is managed. Fiscal management is my responsibility; I sign off on all Town money, so this is indeed something I feel good about.

The most significant thing you can take away from this month's article is that all these good things wouldn't be happening if the Town did not not have the staff it does. Coordination with Highway has been a major focus with the Town Planner, CJ, in rebuilding our infrastructure and has resulted in receiving four grants to accomplish these projects. Our bookkeeper, Laura, and staff have been on top of everyday Town stuff, new budget, end of year report, new grants to get set up for, and weekly warrants. Knowing that our processing of Town money is being done in a excellent manner is a testament to Laura's efforts. It is her experience and dedication to the Town that got the "A".


Danby Youth Shape History

Danby's history in years to come. They are also the ones who will record the Danby history being made today.

One way to whet their appetites for history might be *National History Day*. NHD, in this case, is not a spe-

cific day but an organization. NHD offers year-long academic programs that annually engage more than half a million middle-and high-school students around the world in original history projects.



The largest NHD program is the National History Day Contest in which students around the world conduct research on an historical topic of their choice. If you are a young person with an interest in history or know someone who is, you can learn at [nhd.org]. The contest theme this year is *Triumph and Tragedy in History*.

Danby offers historic insights through its older structures. This year we are hoping to create an organized, updated list of historic houses and other structures (barns? shops? foundations?) in Danby. Your input is important in this effort. By writing, Emailing or phoning the Town Historian about any historic structure you know of—or live in—you can help further this project. Some structures could even quality for the National Register of Historic Places.

Our history display area in the big meeting room of Town Hall will be nearing completion or may even be completed by the time this is published. We will be showing Danby's history through a rotating display of artifacts and ephemera. Have a look when you visit Town Hall.
