I.C. CHAMBER MUSIC CONCERT Submitted by Bill Evans, Community Council

Three fine chamber music groups from the Ithaca College School of Music will perform in Town Hall on Saturday, December 14, 3pm.

The concert will open with a string quartet performing Schubert's Death and the Maiden. Written in 1824, when our own Bald Hill community was struggling to survive, it is considered one of the pillars of chamber music.

At 4pm, a different group will perform Prokofiev's second string quartet. Composed in 1941, as the Nazis were invading Russia, this is a hugely exquisite piece based on melodies from Russian folk songs.

For the program's finale, at about 4:45pm, another third group will perform Schumann's piano quintet, one of the greatest of chamber works. The piece interweaves Town Hall's Chickering baby grand piano (on loan from Bob & Naomi Strichartz) with two violins, a viola, and a cello in wonderfully shifting conversations.

There will be 10-15 minute intermissions between each piece, with refreshments served. This a lengthy program



TOWN CLERK'S DESKTOP

Farewell...sort of

THIS IS MY FINAL TOWN CLERK'S DESKTOP article. My ten years of service to the Town of Danby comes to a formal close at the end of December. When the new year turns, I will have completed five terms as Town Clerk. I've learned a lot about local government and enjoyed getting to know so many people in Danby. The good news is, I will still be in Danby and still involved with our community. I will still see many of you at Fire Station breakfasts, Community Council concerts, and other fun events.



When I started in 2010, there was so much I didn't know about the various jobs and duties of a Town Clerk. I started writing the "Clerk's Desk" articles to help others know about the wide variety of activities we clerks are involved with. I hope that these monthly snapshots and notices of events have given readers of the Danby Area News a better understanding of all the things we do.

I leave feeling good about the organization of and public access to Danby's municipal records. Many are available on

the [townofdanbyny.org] web site. All are organized for long term care and accessibility in Town Hall's document archive. I'm also pleased to say that this should be the most seamless transition of Clerks in decades of Danby history. All the services you've come to need and expect are still here. The only change will be in office hours, with a shift to an earlier start time in the Clerk's office.

Although my 10-year run as Town Clerk ends at the end of December, you will still see me in January, when I stay on to help (as a Deputy Clerk) with property tax collection. Alex Pfiefer will officially be the new Town Clerk starting 2020. Alex enters her role as the official, elected Town Clerk with a solid ground of experience. Please, show her all of the support and understanding which you've given me.

Many people have asked whether I'm looking forward to "retirement." In fact, I'm shifting my career to focus more on music while still working to serve the wider community of Tompkins County and the Southern Tier. In 2018, I earned certification as a Therapeutic Harpist musician and have already begun offering services to skilled nursing facilities, elder care residences, and to patients at Cayuga Medical Center through its spiritual care team. Therapeutic music is responsive and can provide an added layer of support for palliative care, socialization, spiritual care, and mental/emotional well being. I look forward to doing more of this, and to expanding the reach of this beautiful way for music and healing come together. Look into Compassion Harp (bringing therapeutic harp to those in need; [compassionharp.org]) to learn more.

The Town Clerk's office is open in December, on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, 10am-5pm, and Saturday mornings, 10am-Noon. As always, the Town Clerk's office is closed Sundays and Thursdays. We will be closed December 23-January 1 for the Christmas and New Year holidays. The Clerk's office will reopen on January 2 for tax collection. Alex will be starting new hours in January, 8:30am-4pm on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, and 10am-1pm on Saturday.

DANBY HOUSING SURVEY

THE TOWN OF DANBY IS PREPARING to submit a request for grant funding to help its homeowners and tenants with needed structural and mechanical repairs and improvements. In other words, money to help its residents improve their homes.

This Housing Repair Survey of Interest will help identify repair needs. The information you provide about individual households will be kept confidential, but the overall results will help decide whether to continue the application process.

The survey seeks basic information about major problems facing the housing within Danby. Problems that affect health, safety, or energy efficiency should be listed, along with other common problems (roofing, windows and doors, lack of insulation, heating and electrical systems, siding, porches, steps and landings, well and septic issues, plumbing, and interior stairs and flooring).


Your responses are an important factor in obtaining grant funding. While there is no guarantee that the Town will be able to obtain funding for a housing repair program, the more surveys that are collected, the better the chances of showing a need for home improvements, and therefore the better the chance of grant funding.

COUNTY LEGISLATURE UPDATE

Some civil servants are just like my loved ones, they work so hard and they try to be strong. --from the Talking Heads song Don't Worry About the Government

TOMPKINS COUNTY GOVERNMENT EMPLOYS about 770 people. There are blue collar jobs with the Highway Department and airport, there are white collar jobs doing finance, planning, and administration of health, mental health, and social service programs, there are law enforcement jobs as deputies, and corrections officers, and more.

I think of these workers as an important part of the visible and invisible mechanism that helps maintain our quality of life. The term "deep state" was invented as a criticism. An internet definition of "deep state": "members of government agencies believed to be involved in the secret manipulation or control of government policy." Instead, I view the members of government agencies, especially locally, as heroes. They know more than policy makers do about their area of expertise. There is a place for policy makers (which is my job), but without people to carry out those policies, my role would be meaningless.

Most of the jobs with local government are not very well paid. The salaries are not terrible, but I think it's true that most people could make more money in the private sector.

Employees in Tompkins County government are eligible for NY State pensions and decent benefits. All receive a living wage. Whenever I hear someone say that it is unfair that government employees have decent pensions and benefits, I wish that they would flip that idea around and say instead that ALL employees should have decent pensions and benefits. We should widen the circle of who is getting benefits rather than try to take them away from those who do.

In the last decade, NY State has twice reduced the benefits of government pensions for newer hires. That is a shame since the common understanding is that the lower pay government employees receive is offset by a decent pension.

These are just a few thoughts about the employees of Tompkins County government. My constituents are the residents of Danby and Caroline, but I also think of my constituents as the employees of the County, regardless of where they live. I am usually impressed by our employees, and this is a small salute to them.

There are a few other employees I would like to mention. Ric Dietrich has been the Danby Town Supervisor for over 20 years. Pamela Goddard has been the Danby Town Clerk for 10 years. Jack Miller has been a Danby Town Board member for 6 years. They are all in their last month of service. I know from experience that working for the Town is more difficult than working for the County because the Town has far fewer resources. So I also wanted to take this opportunity to thank the outgoing Danby Town officials for their work. If you don't agree with them politically or have other differences with them, that's fine. But consider this: how many of you would be willing take a job where a) people routinely tell you in public that you are wrong and you are expected to just accept it and not return the criticism, and b) every few years your neighbors get to decide if you will keep your job?

BOARD VACANCIES

THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN of Danby invites residents to apply now for volunteer municipal boards seats starting January 2020. Your involvement is welcome and needed.

Each year, one seat opens on the Planning Board and the Board of Zoning Appeals. Planning Board is a seven year term. Board of Zoning Appeals is a five year term. The Planning Board meets monthly, on the third Thursday, to review subdivision and development applications, review and revise the Town Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance. The Board of Zoning Appeals meets as needed, usually on the fourth Tuesday of each month, to hear and decide variance requests related to the Zoning Ordinance. Copies of the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance are available on the Code/Planning page of the Danby web site and in the Town Clerk's office.

There are several open seats (2-year term) on the Conservation Advisory Council. This Advisory Council meets on the second Tuesday of each month, at 7pm. The CAC advises the Board in the development, management, and protection of the Town's natural resources.

The West Danby Water Commissioners, who tend the rural water system in West Danby, have at least one and possibly two vacancies. Contact the Town Clerk for more information.

An appointment application is available through the Town Clerk's office. This simple form includes contact information for the applicant and three simple questions: any experience (professional, educational, etc.) which would assist in the position, a brief description of why you would like to be considered, and what you would hope to accomplish in this position.

THE WAR OF THE PIG

TRUE FACT. The players, United States and Great Britain, with involvement by Canada (tho' not the war of 1812). The year, 1859, just before the Civil War (ours). The place, San Juan (the island not the hill).

It is generally agreed that the War of the Pig was an proxy for the Civil War, but the details are disputed.

The people. John Frémont, the Pathfinder, a surveyor and, in 1856, candidate for President of the United States. George Pickett, a U.S. Army Captain famous for a charge with another army. Henry Robert, a freshly-minted 2nd Lieutenant, who became known for his rules. Charles Griffin owned the pig and Lyman Cutler was an American farmer with a gun.

Fremont's good-for-government-work survey of the U.S.-Canada border (among others) left ownership of San Juan island in question. The British Hudson's Bay Company employed Griffin to manage a ranch on the island. According to Cutler, one of Griffin's pigs, "...was eating my potatoes." Griffin responded, "It is up to you to keep your potatoes out of my pig."

Bear that in mind, good neighbors of Danby.

Cutler fired the gun in the general direction of the pig, killing it. Griffin was not pleased.

Pickett and a few dozen American soldiers were sent to prevent the Brits from occupying the island. The British responded with three warships, followed by two more, all with heavy cannons.

Pickett quipped, "We'll make a Bunker Hill out of it," and promptly placed his light cannons directly under the British guns (see, "Charge, Pickett's"). Robert, meanwhile, built a redoubt (no rules in doubt, for sure) that you can still visit today.

All the officers on both sides were given the same orders: defend yourselves but absolutely do not fire the first shot. The island remained under joint military occupation throughout the American Civil War and was eventually ceded to the United States. This so angered the Canadians, they never forgave either the Brits or the Yanks.

The only casualty of the decade-long war was the pig.
