## HEATING UP: SAFETY TIPS

Hello DANBY! I WOULD LIKE TO INTRODUCE myself, my name is Steve Cortright and I am the newly hired Code Enforcement Officer for the Town

of Danby. I grew up up in West Danby and still live there today. I bring to the job of Code Officer 30 years of construction experience, 15 years experience as a volunteer firefighter in the West Danby Fire Department and 5 years of code enforcement experience with other municipalities.

As we are coming into the heart of the winter heating season, I'd like to talk a little about home heating. Many home fires are caused by faulty heating appliances or improperly installed hearing appliances and vents/chimnevs. The New York State Uniform Building and Fire Safety Code as well as the Code of the Town of Danby require building permits for the permanent installation of heating and cooling appliances and their vents or chimneys. This includes solid fuel burning appliances as well as gas- and oilfired heating appliances.

Residents within the West Danby Water District: if you have a fire hydrant located on your property, please remove the snow (if we ever get any, that is) from three feet around it.

## Safety Tips to help you have a safe heating season...

- keep combustibles a minimum distance of three feet away from ignition sources
- have your heating system serviced annually by a certified service technician
- keep your vent terminations clear of snow and ice to prevent dangerous levels of carbon monoxide buildup in your home
- for woodburning stove/fireplaces keep your your chimney clean to prevent chimney fires and dangerous carbon monoxide buildup
- for coal burning stoves keep the vent pipe clear of coal ash that will settle in the horizontal sections of the pipe and cause the backup of dangerous carbon monoxide
- when removing ashes from a wood or coal appliance use a sturdy, non-combustible container to carry the ashes out of your house and dispose of them a safe distance from any structures (a plastic or paper/ cardboard container is not advisable)
- if using electric space heaters always plug them directly into a wall outlet—never use extension cords-and unplug them when not in use
- if using kerosene or propane space heaters always refuel them outside, away from your home and after they have cooled off
- at the beginning of the heating season check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to make sure they are working. These are very important warning devices within your home.

## HOUSING REPAIR PUBLIC HEARING

**B**ACK IN THE SUMMER OF 2019, the Town of Danby received a NYS Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) award to pay for a comprehensive town-wide survey of housing conditions. The Town used this funding to hire C.T.Male Associates to conduct a town-wide survey and compile the results to help guide future policy decisions about housing needs. Come learn about the results during a Public Hearing on February 24, 7pm, in Danby's Town Hall, 1830 Danby Road (NYS Rt.96B).

You may recall seeing a one-page survey questionnaire in the December issue of the Danby News. This Housing Repair Survey of Interest is available to all homeowners and tenants to identify repair needs that could support Town efforts to obtain future grant funding assistance for eligible residents.

Although the results of the housing analysis will be discussed during the Public Hearing on February 24, the Town will continue to collect Surveys of Interest from residents on an ongoing basis to develop a waiting list for possible housing grant applications. The Survey of Interest is available at [danbyny.org/HomeRepairSurvey] or through me, [planner@townofdanbyny.org] or 607.277.2400. All information collected will be kept confidential and used solely to support the Town's efforts to seek housing grant funds to help qualified residents with needed repairs. Please note that submitting a Survey of Interest does not guarantee that the Town will be able to obtain funding for a housing repair program in the future.

The Public Hearing is open and accessible to all residents and any other interested members of the community.

## SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

UR TOWN OFFICES this year are populated with an almost entirely new staff. While that kind of turnover is not something we would ordinarily want, the result is a fine cast of dedicated public servants. Jason Haremza is our new full-time planner and brings with him over ten years experience with the City of Rochester. He has the skills to help us deal with just about all the planning issues we want to tackle, and that's saying a lot. Steve Cortright, our new code office guy, is a Danby resident and has experience as Code Enforcement Officer in Dryden and Spencer as well as many years of construction experience before that. Alex Pfiefer, our new Town Clerk, is proving to be a quick study, both thorough and conscientious. Her new Deputy Town Clerk, Jenny Caldwell, is a Danby native and both competent and delightfully engaging. I am pleased to be associated with them and fully expect that you will be too.

Our new staff are scrambling to pick up the reins left to them by their predecessors. Expect to hear from them regularly in these pages once they settle in. I wish we had better coverage of what your local government is up to by the press, but that seems to have been lost in recent years. We'll do our best to keep you informed, but self-criticism is not something very many of us are good at. To really know what is going on, get involved!

In January, the Town Board approved creation of a Planning Group to coordinate the planning effort and bring proposals to the Town Board. I was appointed chair. The core membership will consist of interested members of the Town, Planning, and Zoning Appeals boards, as well as the Conservation Advisory Council. Anyone else with an interest is encouraged to join as well. Regular attendance will be rewarded by voting status (you need only attend at least one of the previous two meetings to acquire and retain a vote). That said, we will try to achieve consensus on our recommendations to the Town Board rather than rely on majority vote. The first meeting will be in February. To sign up, contact me (see below). We'll do a Doodle Poll to find the best meeting time, likely to be a Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday evening in the third or fourth week of the month.

What will the Planning Group do? First up will be identifying what interim changes to make to our zoning and subdivision ordinances to reduce their inadequacies while we undertake the major redrafting of these two key laws. We will then step back and ask the overarching questions: What does the community want, where does the community want it, and how can the community enable and facilitate that? This also includes: what do we not want, where don't we want it, and what do we propose to do to prevent and discourage it? If we can come to agreement on these key questions, we can chart a course to a better Danby.

#### 2020 Christmas Bird Count Submitted by Wesley Blauvelt

THE 2020 ITHACA AREA CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT, sponsored by the Cayuga Bird Club was con-

ducted on January 1, 2020. About a dozen Danby area residents participated in the count, which covered much of the Town of Danby.

Thirty-six species were found in Danby during the count, with highlights including a Bald Eagle, Winter Wren and Golden-crowned Kinglets.

The Ithaca area count resulted in 89 species identified and over 23,000 individual counted. birds Among the highlights were five Merlin, a small falcon whose range has been extending south from its Canadian

breeding grounds. High counts were also observed for Turkey Vultures, Song Sparrows, and Great Blackbacked Gulls.

Several species had low counts including Mallards, American Coots, Canada Geese, American Robins, Cedar Waxwings, and American Crows. The decline in American Crows is noteworthy and may be directly related to the spread of West Nile virus among the population.

The count day ended with a potluck dinner and compilation of data collected during the day at the Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology. Thanks to all of the Danby count participants. I hope you will be able to join us again next year for the 59th annual Ithaca area Christmas Bird Count. \$
