- Tompkins county Council of Governments report
- Map and info on Town of Danby 16 acre plot in Deputron Hollow. The town land on Deputron Hollow Rd. was deeded to the town by the state in 1925. The Town paid \$35 for it. The land included two parcels for a total of 24 acres. When we had Monroe title agency look at the title, only one parcel was identified the 16 acre parcel and they could not find, in their search back to 1817, a previous deed for when it might have become owned by the state. The missing parcel might have been part of the land across the street owned by Palmer.
- Distributed binders to all CAC members containing the Danby Comprehensive Plan 2003, and a Hamlet Planning CD.
